



Mr. Jeromie Ballreich, PhD [Jerr-em-ee Ball-ri-ke]
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Dr. Jeromie Ballreich is an Associate Research Professor in the Department of Health Policy and Management at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. His research focuses on three main areas: pharmaceutical economics and policy; economic evaluations; and high-cost/high-needs patient populations. Dr. Ballreich also directs the Master's in Health Economics and Outcomes Research program at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health.

His peer-reviewed work has been published in *New England Journal of Medicine*, *Annals of Internal Medicine*, *American Journal of Managed Care*, and other academic journals. He has been an invited workshop participant and presenter at the National Academy of Medicine, International Society of Pharmacoeconomics and Outcomes Research annual meeting, and other professional societies.

His primary work currently focuses on pharmaceutical pricing policy with the Johns Hopkins Drug Access and Affordability Initiative (JHDAAI), where he is a core faculty member. In the space, his ongoing and recently completed projects include research on the US pharmaceutical market. He is a co-investigator on a grant from the Laura and John Arnold Foundation and a principal investigator on a grant from the Commonwealth Fund. He has published regarding the accelerated approval pathway in the US pharmaceutical market. He has also been involved in the assessment and implementation of the Inflation Reduction Act in the US pharmaceutical market, which is supported by the grant from the Commonwealth Foundation. Lastly, he is evaluating factors associated with the US drug supply chain and drug shortages.
