Biography

Dr. Josh Rauh is the Ormond Family Professor of Finance at Stanford's Graduate School of Business and a senior fellow at the Hoover Institution, where he leads the State and Local Government Initiative. The Hoover Institution is a public policy think tank dedicated to promoting economic liberty, free enterprise, and limited government.

Dr. Rauh has been published many times in peer-reviewed academic journals, including the *Journal of Finance* and the *Journal of Political Economy*. His work has received national media coverage, and he frequently appears in newspapers and magazines such as the *Wall Street Journal, the New York Times*, and *The Economist*. For his work, he has received various awards, including the Brattle Prize and the Smith Breeden Prize of the American Finance Association.

Dr. Rauh has also served as the principal chief economist on the Council of Economic Advisers (2019-2020), has taught at the University of Chicago's Booth School of Business (2004-2009) and the Kellogg School of Management (2009-2012). Dr. Rauh is also a member of the Panel of Economic Advisers of the Congressional Budget Office.

Dr. Rauh received his BA in economics from Yale and a PhD in economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
