



Elizabeth Curda

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Ms. Curda is Director of the Education, Workforce, and Income Security team at the Government Accountability Office (GAO), focusing on federal disability program issues at the Social Security Administration (SSA), the Department of Veterans Affairs, and the Railroad Retirement Board, among others. Ms. Curda's recent work related to the SSA has involved ongoing monitoring of the SSA's progress in addressing high risk issues in its disability programs; service delivery during the pandemic; expediting disability appeals for critical cases; the screening and training of disability medical consultants; and the benefits and costs, including overpayments, of the Ticket to Work program.

Prior to 2017, Ms. Curda was an acting director on GAO's health care team where her work focused on behavioral and other health care issues and Veterans Affairs oversight of provider credentialing. Prior to 2015, Ms. Curda was an assistant director for GAO's Strategic Issues team where she led audits and advised agency officials and GAO teams on the use of strategic planning and other leading performance management techniques to achieve results. Ms. Curda's wide-ranging body of work informed the 2010 modernization of the *Government Performance and Results Act*.

Prior to joining GAO in 1992, Ms. Curda held senior analyst positions at the New York City Office of Management and Budget and the consulting firm, National Economic Research Associates. Ms. Curda holds a master's in public administration from Columbia University and a BA in economics from Smith College.
