Will Raderman is an employment policy analyst in the social policy department of the Niskanen Center, a non-partisan public policy think tank in Washington, D.C. Will works on employment and social insurance policy issues, with a specific focus on unemployment and disability benefits. Will is author of several reports on employment policy. His most recent paper, published in May 2024, explores how to reform UI administrative financing to ensure all states can rely on sufficient and predictable administrative funding to improve system operations and program integrity.

Will earned a degree in applied mathematics from George Washington University and a master's degree in population health from University College London. Prior to joining the Niskanen Center, Will served as a research fellow at Boston University, where he tracked and analyzed state policy actions during the COVID-19 pandemic, focusing on unemployment insurance and paid leave. Raderman's work has been featured in the Washington Post, The Hill, the San Francisco Chronicle, CNBC, and Health Affairs.
