Biography

Randy Spronk, a pork producer and farmer from Pipestone, Minnesota, is a Past President of the National Pork Producers Council. His farming business includes pork production and crop farming, Randy, along with his brother Gordon and son Seth, farm 2,550 acres of corn and soybeans in addition to marketing 265,000 butcher hogs in calendar year 2022. Randy began his career farming in partnership with his father in 1981, after graduating from South Dakota State University with a Bachelor of Science in Animal Science. Spronk Brothers Holdings has ownership in four sow farms totaling 16,800 maternal females, an on-farm feed mill manufacturing and delivering over 150,000 tons of finished feed annually, ownership of 23,600 finishing spaces, and shares in WholeStone Foods, a pork harvest plant in Fremont, Nebraska.

Spronk served on the NPPC Board of Directors from 2008 to 2015, serving and chairing numerous committees, including Budget and Environment. He is a member of the Pipestone County Pork Producers Association, a member of the National Pork Producers International Trade Committee, and serves on the executive committee of the US Meat Export Federation. He also participates in the Minnesota Pork Producers Association and the United States Meat Export Federation.

Spronk is a graduate of South Dakota State University.
