



Ambassador Gregg Doud, President and CEO, National Milk Producers Federation

GREGG DOUD is an expert on agriculture, the dairy industry, and the barriers American farmers face in markets like Canada, the European Union, and China. Originally from Kansas, he earned his Master's degree in agricultural economics.

EXPERIENCE After being raised on a dry-land wheat, grain, sorghum, soybean, swine, and cow-calf operation, Amb. Doud began his career as a market analyst for the U.S. Wheat Associates. He went on to serve as the Chief Economist for the National Cattlemen's Beef Association.

U.S. SENATE Ambassador Doud's agricultural expertise made him an asset to the U.S. Senate when he became a senior staff member of the Senate Agriculture Committee. He helped to craft the 2012 Senate Farm Bill, drawing on his knowledge of international trade, food aid, and livestock. He also worked on policy related to oversight of the Commodity Futures Trading Commission.

USTR In 2018, Amb. Doud was confirmed by the U.S. Senate to serve as the Chief Agricultural Officer at the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative during President Trump's first term. Attaining the rank of U.S. Ambassador, he played a major role in negotiating the USMCA and the China Phase-One and Japan Phase-One Agreements.

ADDITIONAL LEADERSHIP Before becoming President and CEO of the National Milk Producers Federation (NMPF), Ambassador Doud was Aimpoint Research's Vice President of Global Situational Awareness and Chief Economist. Overall, Doud has over 20 years of experience in Washington, D.C.
