Philip Hackney is an associate professor of law at the University of Pittsburgh, where he focuses his scholarship on tax-exempt entities. Specifically, Hackney has expertise in the intersection of tax law and charitable and social welfare organizations, campaign finance operations, and labor unions. Hackney has taught tax law at the University of Pittsburgh since 2018. Before that, he was a professor at the Paul M. Hebert Law Center in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Hackney has previously testified before the Senate Finance Subcommittee on Taxation and IRS Oversight.

Prior to his academic career, Hackney served as a senior technician reviewer for the IRS Exempt Organizations (EO) Division from 2006 to 2011. There, he drafted regulations, advised the commissioner, and litigated exempt organization tax issues. Hackney received his J.D. from the Paul M. Hebert Law Center and his LL.M. in tax law from New York University.
