Latest Developments

Hezbollah <u>fired</u> two rockets at the northern Israeli community of Arab al-Aramshe on January 18. The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) <u>said</u> the rockets fell in open areas. Israeli "fighter jets struck Hezbollah terror infrastructure in the area of Al-Adisa in southern Lebanon," the IDF <u>said</u>. The Hezbollah attack took place a day after IDF Chief of Staff Herzi Halevi <u>said</u> that the likelihood of war with Hezbollah is higher than in the past. "I don't know when the war in the north is, I can tell you that the likelihood of it happening in the coming months is much higher than it was in the past," Halevi said.

"Hezbollah continues to fire rockets and anti-tank missiles at northern Israel, threatening Israelis and preventing them from returning to their communities. Hezbollah's threats should be removed from the border region, and the Iranianbacked group must be deterred from further attacks. Israel must be supported in its actions to deter Hezbollah and prevent terrorist threats to northern Israel." — *Seth*

"While the likelihood of war with Hezbollah is possible, the past three months have shown that both sides are not interested in widening the conflict that has generally been limited to the border area. However, any major incident causing significant casualties on either side can ignite a full-scale confrontation." — *Joe Truzman, Senior Research Analyst at FDD's Long War Journal*

Halevi <u>visited</u> northern Israel on January 17 to meet with high-level IDF commanders and view a military exercise. "We are in a time of increasing readiness for fighting in Lebanon. We have a lot of lessons from the fighting in

Gaza, many of which are very relevant to fighting in Lebanon, and there are some that must be adapted," Halevi <u>said</u>. He emphasized the importance of <u>returning</u> to their homes the 80,000 Israelis who were <u>evacuated</u> from the north due to daily Hezbollah attacks. According to the IDF, more than 2,000 <u>rockets</u> have been fired from Lebanon at northern Israel since Hamas attacked Israel on October 7.

Hezbollah Attacks Continue Daily

Hezbollah <u>launched</u> rockets and an anti-tank missile from Lebanon at Israel on January 17, targeting communities near the Mediterranean Sea. The IDF responded by striking the terrorist cell responsible. "We are continually engaged in eliminating and diminishing Hezbollah's abilities and pushing it back. There's still much work to be done, much to do to achieve the desired result of enhanced security, so that we can bring the northern communities back home," <u>said</u> Maj. Gen. Ori Gordin, head of Israel's Northern Command, on January 15.
