A BILL

To amend title 5, United States Code, to protect unpaid interns in the Federal government from workplace harassment and discrimination, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Federal Intern Protec-*
5 *tion Act of 2015”.*

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITED PERSONNEL PRACTICES.**

7 *(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 2302 of title 5, United*
8 *States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:*

9 *“(g)(1) All protections afforded to an employee under*
10 *subparagraphs (A), (B), and (D) of subsection (b)(1) shall*
11 *be afforded, in the same manner and to the same extent,*
12 *to an intern and an applicant for internship.*

13 *“(2) For purposes of the application of this subsection,*
14 *a reference to an employee shall be considered a reference*
15 *to an intern in—*

16 *“(A) section 717 of the Civil Rights Act of 1964*
17 *(42 U.S.C. 2000e–16);*

18 *“(B) sections 12 and 15 of the Age Discrimina-*
19 *tion in Employment Act of 1967 (29 U.S.C. 631,*
20 *633a); and*

21 *“(C) section 501 of the Rehabilitation Act of*
22 *1973 (29 U.S.C. 791).*

23 *“(3) In this subsection, the term ‘intern’ means an in-*
24 *dividual who performs uncompensated voluntary service in*

1 *an agency to earn credit awarded by an educational insti-*
2 *tution or to learn a trade or occupation.”.*

3 (b) *CONFORMING AMENDMENT.*—*Section 3111(c)(1) of*
4 *title 5, United States Code, is amended by inserting “sec-*
5 *tion 2302(g) (relating to prohibited personnel practices),”*
6 *before “chapter 81”.*

Amend the title so as to read: “A bill to amend title 5, United States Code, to protect unpaid interns in the Federal Government from workplace harassment and discrimination, and for other purposes.”.
