A BILL

To require a study by the Comptroller General of the United States on Good Samaritan laws that pertain to treatment of opioid overdoses, and for other purposes. 3

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Good Samaritan As-5 sessment Act of 2016".

6 SEC. 2. FINDING.

7 The Congress finds that the executive branch, includ-8 ing the Office of National Drug Control Policy, has a pol-9 icy focus on preventing and addressing prescription drug 10 misuse and heroin use, and has worked with States and municipalities to enact Good Samaritan laws that would 11 protect caregivers, law enforcement personnel, and first 12 13 responders who administer opioid overdose reversal drugs 14 or devices.

15 SEC. 3. GAO STUDY ON GOOD SAMARITAN LAWS PER-16TAINING TO TREATMENT OF OPIOID17OVERDOSES.

18 The Comptroller General of the United States shall 19 submit to the Committee on the Judiciary of the House 20 of Representatives, the Committee on Oversight and Gov-21 ernment Reform of the House of Representatives, the 22 Committee on the Judiciary of the Senate, and the Com-23 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs 24 of the Senate a report on4

(1) the extent to which the Director of National
 Drug Control Policy has reviewed Good Samaritan
 laws, and any findings from such a review, including
 findings related to the potential effects of such laws,
 if available;

6 (2) efforts by the Director to encourage the en-7 actment of Good Samaritan laws; and

8 (3) a compilation of Good Samaritan laws in ef9 fect in the States, the territories, and the District of
10 Columbia.

11 SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.

12 In this Act—

(1) the term "Good Samaritan law" means a
law of a State or unit of local government that exempts from criminal or civil liability any individual
who administers an opioid overdose reversal drug or
device, or who contacts emergency services providers
in response to an overdose; and

(2) the term "opioid" means any drug, including heroin, having an addiction-forming or addictionsustaining liability similar to morphine or being capable of conversion into a drug having such addiction-forming or addiction-sustaining liability.
