To direct the Secretary of Homeland Security to notify air carriers and security screening personnel of the Transportation Security Administration of such Administration's guidelines regarding permitting baby formula, breast milk, and juice on airplanes, and for other purposes.

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## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Homeland Security to notify air carriers and security screening personnel of the Transportation Security Administration of such Administration's guidelines regarding permitting baby formula, breast milk, and juice on airplanes, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Bottles and Breast-  
3 feeding Equipment Screening Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. TSA SECURITY SCREENING GUIDELINES FOR BABY**  
5 **FORMULA, BREAST MILK, PURIFIED DEION-**  
6 **IZED WATER FOR INFANTS, AND JUICE ON**  
7 **AIRPLANES; TRAINING ON SPECIAL PROCE-**  
8 **DURES.**

9 Not later than 90 days after the date of the enact-  
10 ment of this Act, the Administrator of the Transportation  
11 Security Administration shall—

12 (1) notify air carriers and security screening  
13 personnel of the Transportation Security Adminis-  
14 tration and personnel of private security companies  
15 providing security screening pursuant to section  
16 44920 of title 49, United States Code, of such Ad-  
17 ministration’s guidelines regarding permitting baby  
18 formula, breast milk, purified deionized water for in-  
19 fants, and juice on airplanes under the Administra-  
20 tion’s guidelines known as the 3–1–1 Liquids Rule  
21 Exemption; and

22 (2) in training procedures for security screening  
23 personnel of the Administration and private security  
24 companies providing security screening pursuant to  
25 section 44920 of title 49, United States Code, in-  
26 clude training on special screening procedures.

Amend the title so as to read: “A bill to direct the Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration to notify air carriers and security screening personnel of the Transportation Security Administration of such Administration’s guidelines regarding permitting baby formula, breast milk, purified deionized water, and juice on airplanes, and for other purposes.”.
