Mr. DENHAM (for himself and Mr. PASCRELL) introduced the following bill;
which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To amend the Tariff Act of 1930 to protect personally
identifiable information, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Moving Americans Pri-
5 vacy Protection Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROTECTION OF PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE IN-**
2 **FORMATION.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 431(c)(2) of the Tariff
4 Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1431(c)(2)) is amended to read
5 as follows:

6 “(2)(A) The information listed in paragraph (1) shall
7 not be available for public disclosure if—

8 “(i) the Secretary of the Treasury makes an af-
9 firmative finding on a shipment-by-shipment basis
10 that disclosure is likely to pose a threat of personal
11 injury or property damage; or

12 “(ii) the information is exempt under the provi-
13 sions of section 552(b)(1) of title 5, United States
14 Code.

15 “(B) The Secretary shall ensure that any personally
16 identifiable information, including Social Security account
17 numbers and passport numbers, is removed from any
18 manifest signed, produced, delivered, or electronically
19 transmitted under this section before access to the mani-
20 fest is provided to the public.”.

21 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
22 subsection (a) shall take effect on the date that is 30 days
23 after the date of the enactment of this Act.
