SEC. 2. CRIMINAL PENALTY FOR UNAUTHORIZED DISCLO SURES.

3 Section 165 of the Financial Stability Act of 2010
4 (12 U.S.C. 5365) is amended by adding at the end the

6 "(1) CRIMINAL PENALTY FOR UNAUTHORIZED DIS-7 CLOSURES.—Section 552a(i)(1) of title 5, United States Code, shall apply to a determination made under sub-8 9 section (d) or (i) based on individually identifiable information submitted pursuant to the requirements of this 10 section to the same extent as such section 552a(i)(1) ap-11 plies to agency records which contain individually identifi-12 able information the disclosure of which is prohibited by 13 such section 552a or by rules or regulations established 14 thereunder.". 15

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill to amend the Financial Stability Act of 2010 to provide a criminal penalty for unauthorized disclosures by officers or employees of a Federal agency of certain living will and stress test determinations.".
