# **A BILL**

To require a review of Department of Homeland Security  
trusted traveler programs, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4        This Act may be cited as the “Trusted Traveler Re-  
5 consideration and Restoration Act of 2019”.

6 **SEC. 2. COMPTROLLER GENERAL REVIEW.**

7        Not later than one year after the date of the enact-  
8 ment of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United  
9 States shall conduct a review of Department of Homeland  
10 Security trusted traveler programs. Such review shall ex-  
11 amine the following:

12            (1) The extent to which the Department of  
13 Homeland Security tracks data and monitors trends  
14 related to trusted traveler programs, including root  
15 causes for identity-matching errors resulting in an  
16 individual’s enrollment in a trusted traveler program  
17 being reinstated.

18            (2) Whether the Department coordinates with  
19 the heads of other relevant Federal, State, local,  
20 Tribal, or territorial entities regarding redress proce-  
21 dures for disqualifying offenses not covered by the  
22 Department’s own redress processes but which of-  
23 fenses impact an individual’s enrollment in a trusted  
24 traveler program.

1           (3) How the Department may improve individ-  
2 uals' access to reconsideration procedures regarding  
3 a disqualifying offense for enrollment in a trusted  
4 traveler program that requires the involvement of  
5 any other Federal, State, local, Tribal, or territorial  
6 entity.

7           (4) The extent to which travelers are informed  
8 about reconsideration procedures regarding enroll-  
9 ment in a trusted traveler program.

10 **SEC. 3. ENROLLMENT REDRESS.**

11       Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Sec-  
12 retary of Homeland Security shall, with respect to an indi-  
13 vidual whose enrollment in a trusted traveler program was  
14 revoked in error extend by an amount of time equal to  
15 the period of revocation the period of active enrollment  
16 in such a program upon re-enrollment in such a program  
17 by such an individual.
