A BILL

To authorize the Fallen Journalists Memorial Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Fallen Journalists Me-
5 morial Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION TO ESTABLISH COMMEMORATIVE**
2 **WORK.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Fallen Journalists Memorial
4 Foundation may establish a commemorative work on Fed-
5 eral land in the District of Columbia and its environs to
6 commemorate America’s commitment to a free press by
7 honoring journalists who sacrificed their lives in service
8 to that cause.

9 (b) COMPLIANCE WITH STANDARDS FOR COMMEMO-
10 RATIVE WORKS.—The establishment of the commemora-
11 tive work under this section shall be in accordance with
12 chapter 89 of title 40, United States Code (commonly
13 known as the “Commemorative Works Act”).

14 (c) PROHIBITION ON USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS.—

15 (1) IN GENERAL.—Federal funds may not be
16 used to pay any expense of the establishment of the
17 commemorative work under this section.

18 (2) RESPONSIBILITY OF THE FALLEN JOURNAL-
19 ISTS MEMORIAL FOUNDATION.—The Fallen Journal-
20 ists Memorial Foundation shall be solely responsible
21 for acceptance of contributions for, and payment of
22 the expenses of, the establishment of the commemo-
23 rative work under this section.

24 (d) DEPOSIT OF EXCESS FUNDS.—

25 (1) IN GENERAL.—If upon payment of all ex-
26 penses for the establishment of the commemorative

1 work (including the maintenance and preservation
2 amount required by section 8906(b)(1) of title 40,
3 United States Code), there remains a balance of
4 funds received for the establishment of the com-
5 memorative work, the Fallen Journalists Memorial
6 Foundation shall transmit the amount of the balance
7 to the Secretary of the Interior for deposit in the ac-
8 count provided for in section 8906(b)(3) of title 40,
9 United States Code.

10 (2) ON EXPIRATION OF AUTHORITY.—If upon
11 expiration of the authority for the commemorative
12 work under section 8903(e) of title 40, United
13 States Code, there remains a balance of funds re-
14 ceived for the establishment of the commemorative
15 work, the Fallen Journalists Memorial Foundation
16 shall transmit the amount of the balance to a sepa-
17 rate account with the National Park Foundation for
18 memorials, to be available to the Secretary of the In-
19 terior or Administrator (as appropriate) following
20 the process provided in section 8906(b)(4) of title
21 40, United States Code, for accounts established
22 under section 8906(b)(2) or (3) of title 40, United
23 States Code.

1 **SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

2 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
3 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
4 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
5 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this
6 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
7 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-
8 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the
9 vote on passage.
