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1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Bringing Registered
3 Apprenticeships to Veterans Education Act" or the
4 "BRAVE Act".

5 SEC. 2. EDUCATION FOR SEPARATING MEMBERS OF THE 6 ARMED FORCES REGARDING REGISTERED 7 APPRENTICESHIPS.

8 Section 1144(b)(1) of title 10, United States Code, 9 is amended by inserting "(including apprenticeship pro-10 grams registered under the Act of August 16, 1937 (50 11 Stat. 664; commonly referred to as the 'National Appren-12 ticeship Act') and approved under chapters 30 through 36 13 of title 38)" after "employment opportunities".

14 SEC. 3. WEBSITES REGARDING APPRENTICESHIP PRO-15GRAMS.

16 (a) WEBSITE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF SEC-RETARY OF LABOR.—The Assistant Secretary of Labor 17 for Veterans' Employment and Training, in coordination 18 19 with the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, shall establish a user-friendly website (or update an existing website) that 20 21 is available to the public on which veterans can find infor-22 mation about apprenticeship programs registered under 23 the Act of August 16, 1937 (50 Stat. 664; commonly re-24 ferred to as the "National Apprenticeship Act") and approved under chapters 30 through 36 of title 38, United 25 States Code. Such information shall be searchable and 26

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sortable by occupation and location, and include, with re gard to each such program, the following:

- 3 (1) A description, including any cost to a vet-4 eran.
- 5 (2) Contact information.

6 (3) Whether the program has been endorsed by
7 a veterans service organization or nonprofit organi8 zation that caters to veterans.

9 (4) Whether the program prefers to hire vet-10 erans.

(5) Each certification or degree an individualearns by completing the program.

(b) COORDINATION WITH OTHER WEBSITE.—The
Assistant Secretary shall update all information regarding
programs for veterans listed on apprenticeship.gov (or any
successor website) to include the information specified
under subsection (a).
