Mrs. PELTOLA introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to establish in the Department of Veterans Affairs an Office of Food Security, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Food Security for All
5 Veterans Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS**
2 **AFFAIRS OFFICE OF FOOD SECURITY.**

3 Chapter 3 of title 38, United States Code, is amended
4 by adding at the end the following new section (and con-
5 forming the table of sections at the beginning of such
6 chapter accordingly):

7 **“§ 325. Office of Food Security**

8 “(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is in the Department
9 an office to be known as the ‘Office of Food Security’.
10 There is at the head of the Office a Director, which shall
11 be a career position.

12 “(b) RESPONSIBILITIES.—(1) The Director of the Of-
13 fice of Food Security shall carry out the following respon-
14 sibilities:

15 “(A) To provide information to veterans con-
16 cerning the availability of, and eligibility require-
17 ments for Federal nutrition assistance programs.

18 “(B) To collaborate with other program offices
19 of the Department, including the Homeless Pro-
20 grams Office and the Office of Tribal Government
21 Relations, to develop and implement policies and
22 procedures to identify and treat veterans at-risk or
23 experiencing food insecurity.

24 “(C) To collaborate with the Secretary of Agri-
25 culture and the Secretary of Defense on food insecu-
26 rity among veterans, including by collaborating with

1 the Secretaries to develop materials related to food
2 insecurity for the Transition Assistance Program
3 curriculum and other transition-related resources.

4 “(D) To develop and provide training, including
5 training that may count towards continuing edu-
6 cation or licensure requirements, for social workers,
7 dietitians, chaplains, and other clinicians on how to
8 assist veterans with enrollment in Federal nutrition
9 assistance programs, including the supplemental nu-
10 trition assistance program and the special supple-
11 mental nutrition program for women, infants, and
12 children established by section 17 of the Child Nu-
13 trition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1786).

14 “(E) To issue guidance to Department medical
15 centers on how to collaborate with their State and
16 local offices administering the supplemental nutri-
17 tion assistance program.

18 “(2) In carrying out the responsibilities under para-
19 graph (1), the Director shall consult with and provide
20 technical assistance to the heads of other Federal depart-
21 ments and agencies, including the Department of Agri-
22 culture, Department of Defense, Department of Interior,
23 and Department of Labor.

24 “(c) ANNUAL REPORT ON FOOD INSECURITY.—The
25 Secretary of Veterans Affairs, in consultation with the

1 Secretary of Agriculture, shall submit to the Committees
2 on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and House of Rep-
3 resentatives an annual report on veteran food insecurity.

4 Each such report shall include data on the following:

5 “(1) The socioeconomic, ethnic, and racial char-
6 acteristics of veterans experiencing food insecurity,
7 disaggregated by State in which the veteran is lo-
8 cated.

9 “(2) Native American veterans experiencing
10 food insecurity.

11 “(3) Specific interventions for veterans who
12 screen positive for food insecurity.

13 “(4) Eligibility screenings for participation in
14 the supplemental nutrition assistance program com-
15 pleted by personnel of the Department of Veterans
16 Affairs.

17 “(5) The number of applications for participa-
18 tion in the supplemental nutrition assistance pro-
19 gram completed with assistance from personnel of
20 the Department.

21 “(6) Changes, as a result of participation in the
22 supplemental nutrition assistance program, in the
23 number of food insecure veteran households.

24 “(7) Coordination efforts between State agen-
25 cies and Department facilities located in that State

1 regarding outreach to veterans to participate in the
2 supplemental nutrition assistance program.

3 “(d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

4 “(1) The terms ‘Native American’ and ‘Native
5 American veteran’ have the meanings given those
6 terms in section 3765 of this title.

7 “(2) The terms ‘State agency’ and ‘supple-
8 mental nutrition assistance program’ have the mean-
9 ings given those terms in section 3 of the Food and
10 Nutrition Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2012).”.

11 **SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**

12 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
13 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
14 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
15 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this
16 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
17 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-
18 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the
19 vote on passage.
