A BILL

To provide for certain reports on enrollment in the Lifeline program, and for other purposes. 3

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Ensuring Phone and
5 Internet Access Through Lifeline and Affordable
6 Connectivity Program Act of 2022".

7 SEC. 2. REPORTS ON ENROLLMENT IN CERTAIN PROGRAMS.

8 (a) ANNUAL REPORT ON ENROLLMENT IN LIFELINE 9 AND AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAMS THROUGH 10 QUALIFYING PROGRAMS.—Not later than 1 year after the 11 date of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter 12 for 2 calendar years after the calendar year during which 13 the first report is submitted under this subsection, the Com-14 mission shall submit to Congress a report on—

(1) enrollment in the Lifeline program by individuals participating in each of the Lifeline qualifying programs, broken out by each of the Lifeline
qualifying programs, to the extent the Commission
holds or has access to the necessary data relating to
such enrollment; and

(2) enrollment in the Affordable Connectivity
Program by individuals participating in each of the
Affordable Connectivity Program qualifying programs, broken out by each of the Affordable
Connectivity Program qualifying programs, to the ex-

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tent the Commission holds or has access to the nec essary data relating to such enrollment.

3 (b) GAO STUDY AND REPORT ON EFFORTS TO PRO-4 MOTE ENROLLMENT IN LIFELINE AND AFFORDABLE 5 CONNECTIVITY PROGRAMS.—Not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General 6 7 of the United States shall submit a report to Congress iden-8 tifying outreach and publicity efforts to promote participa-9 tion and enrollment in the Lifeline program and, sepa-10 rately, the Affordable Connectivity Program.

11 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

12 (1)Affordable CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM 13 PROGRAM.—The *"Affordable* QUALIFYING term 14 Connectivity Program qualifying program" means 15 the programs set forth in paragraphs (1), (3), (4), 16 and (6) of section 54.1800(j) of title 47, Code of Fed-17 eral Regulations, or any successor regulation.

18 (2) COMMISSION.—The term "Commission"
19 means the Federal Communications Commission.

20 (3) LIFELINE QUALIFYING PROGRAM.—The term
21 "Lifeline qualifying program" means the programs
22 set forth in subsections (a)(2) and (b) of section
23 54.409 of title 47, Code of Federal Regulations, or
24 any successor regulation.

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
