# **S. 3510**

## **AN ACT**

- To require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to issue guidance with respect to natural disaster resilience, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
2	This Act may be cited as the "Disaster Resiliency
3	Planning Act".
4	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
5	In this Act:
6	(1) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMIT-
7	TEES.—The term "appropriate congressional com-
8	mittees" means—
9	(A) the Committee on Homeland Security
10	and Governmental Affairs of the Senate; and
11	(B) the Committee on Oversight and Re-
12	form of the House of Representatives.
13	(2) AGENCY.—The term "agency" has the
14	meaning given the term in section 306 of title 5,
15	United States Code.
16	(3) DIRECTOR.—The term "Director" means
17	the Director of the Office of Management and Budg-
18	et.
19	(4) REAL PROPERTY.—The term "real prop-
20	erty" has the meaning given the term in section
21	1.856–10 of title 26, Code of Federal Regulations,
22	or any successor thereto.
23	SEC. 3. GUIDANCE.
24	(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
25	date of enactment of this Act, the Director shall establish
26	guidance requiring the head of each agency to incorporate

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natural disaster resilience into real property asset manage ment and investment decisions made by the agency.

3 (b) CONTENTS.—The guidance required under sub-4 section (a) shall direct each head of an agency to incor-5 porate assessments of natural disaster risk information 6 conducted by the agency, such as from vulnerability and 7 other risk assessments, into real property asset manage-8 ment investment decisions made by the agency.

9 (c) MODIFICATION.—The Director may periodically 10 update the guidance required under subsection (a) as the 11 Director may determine necessary for the purpose of fur-12 ther enhancing natural disaster resilience.

(d) CONSULTATION.—In developing the guidance required under subsection (a), the Director may consult with
appropriate entities, including—

16 (1) the Comptroller General of the United17 States;

18 (2) the Administrator of the Federal Emer-19 gency Management Agency; and

20 (3) any other relevant entities, as determined21 by the Director.

22 (e) REPORT.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
the date of enactment of this Act, the Director shall
submit to the appropriate congressional committees

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a report that describes the guidance required under
 subsection (a).

3 (2) BRIEFING.—Not later than 2 years after
4 the date of enactment of this Act, the Director shall
5 brief the appropriate congressional committees on
6 the implementation of the guidance required under
7 subsection (a) across agencies.
