# A BILL

- To amend title 38, United States Code, to authorize the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to award grants to States to improve outreach to veterans, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Commitment to Vet-
- 5 eran Support and Outreach Act".

1	SEC. 2. AUTHORITY FOR SECRETARY OF VETERANS AF-
2	FAIRS TO AWARD GRANTS TO STATES AND IN-
3	DIAN TRIBES TO IMPROVE OUTREACH TO
4	VETERANS.
5	(a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 63 of title 38, United
6	States Code, is amended—
7	(1) by redesignating sections $6307$ and $6308$
8	and sections 6308 and 6309, respectively; and
9	(2) by inserting after section 6306 the following
10	new section 6307:
11	"§6307. Grants to States and Indian Tribes to im-
12	prove outreach to veterans
13	"(a) PURPOSE.—It is the purpose of this section to
14	provide for assistance by the Secretary to States and In-
15	dian Tribes to carry out programs that—
16	"(1) improve outreach and assistance to vet-
17	erans and the spouses, children, and parents of vet-
18	erans, to ensure that such individuals are fully in-
19	formed about any veterans and veterans-related ben-
20	efits and programs (including veterans programs of
21	a State or Indian Tribe) for which they may be eligi-
22	ble; and
23	"(2) facilitate opportunities for such individuals
24	to receive competent, qualified services in the prepa-
25	ration, presentation, and prosecution of veterans
26	benefits claims.

"(b) AUTHORITY.—The Secretary may award grants
 under this section to States and Indian Tribes—

3 "(1) to carry out, coordinate, improve, or other4 wise enhance outreach activities;

5 "(2) to increase the number of county or Tribal 6 veterans service officers serving in the State or In-7 dian Tribe by hiring new, additional such officers; or "(3) to expand, carry out, coordinate, improve, 8 9 or otherwise enhance existing programs, activities, 10 and services of the existing organization of the State 11 or Indian Tribe that has been recognized by the De-12 partment of Veterans Affairs pursuant to section

5902, in the preparation, presentation, and prosecution of claims for veterans benefits through representatives who hold positions as county or Tribal
veterans service officers.

"(c) APPLICATION.—(1) To be eligible for a grant
under this section, a State or Indian Tribe shall submit
to the Secretary an application therefor at such time, in
such manner, and containing such information as the Secretary may require.

22 "(2) Each application submitted under paragraph (1)23 shall include the following:

24 "(A) A detailed plan for the use of the grant.

"(B) A description of the programs through
 which the State or Indian Tribe will meet the out come measures developed by the Secretary under
 subsection (i).

5 "(C) A description of how the State or Indian
6 Tribe will distribute grant amounts equitably among
7 counties (or Tribal lands, as the case may be) with
8 varying levels of urbanization.

9 "(D) A plan for how the grant will be used to
10 meet the unique needs of American Indian or Alaska
11 Native veterans, elderly veterans, women veterans,
12 and veterans from other underserved communities.

"(d) DISTRIBUTION.—The Secretary shall seek to ensure that grants awarded under this section are equitably
distributed among States and Indian Tribes with varying
levels of urbanization.

17 "(e) PRIORITY.—The Secretary shall prioritize
18 awarding grants under this section that will serve the fol19 lowing areas:

20 "(1) Areas with a critical shortage of county or21 Tribal veterans service officers.

22 "(2) Areas with high rates of—

- 23 "(A) suicide among veterans; or
- 24 "(B) referrals to the Veterans Crisis Line.

"(f) USE OF COUNTY OR TRIBAL VETERANS SERV ICE OFFICERS.—A State or Indian Tribe that receives a
 grant under this section to carry out an activity described
 in subsection (b)(1) may only carry out the activity
 through—

6 "(1) a county or Tribal veterans service officer
7 of the State or Indian Tribe; or

8 "(2) if the State or Indian Tribe does not have 9 a county or Tribal veterans service officer, or if the 10 county or Tribal veterans service officers of the 11 State or Indian Tribe cover only a portion of that 12 State or Indian Tribe, an appropriate entity of a 13 State, local, or Tribal government, as determined by 14 the Secretary.

15 "(g) REQUIRED ACTIVITIES.—Any grant awarded
16 under this section shall be used—

17 "(1) to expand existing programs, activities,18 and services;

19 "(2) to hire and maintain new, additional coun20 tv or Tribal veterans service officers; or

21 "(3) for travel and transportation to facilitate
22 carrying out paragraph (1) or (2).

23 "(h) OTHER PERMISSIBLE ACTIVITIES.—A grant
24 under this section may be used to provide education and
25 training, including on-the-job training, for State, county,

local, and Tribal government employees who provide (or
 when trained will provide) veterans outreach services in
 order for those employees to obtain and maintain accredi tation in accordance with procedures approved by the Sec retary.

6 "(i) OUTCOME MEASURES.—(1) The Secretary shall
7 develop and provide to each State or Indian Tribe that
8 receives a grant under this section written guidance on
9 the following:

10 "(A) Outcome measures.

11 "(B) Policies of the Department.

12 "(2) In developing outcome measures under para13 graph (1), the Secretary shall consider the following goals:
14 "(A) Increasing the use of veterans and vet15 erans-related benefits, particularly among vulnerable

16 populations.

17 "(B) Increasing the number of county and
18 Tribal veterans service officers recognized by the
19 Secretary for the representation of veterans under
20 chapter 59 of this title.

21 "(j) TRACKING REQUIREMENTS.—(1) With respect 22 to each grant awarded under this section, the Secretary 23 shall track the use of veterans benefits among the popu-24 lation served by the grant, including the average period 25 of time between the date on which a veteran or other eligi-

ble claimant applies for such a benefit and the date on
 which the veteran or other eligible claimant receives the
 benefit, disaggregated by type of benefit.

4 "(2) Not less frequently than annually during the life
5 of the grant program established under this section, the
6 Secretary shall submit to Congress a report on—

7 "(A) the information tracked under paragraph8 (1);

9 "(B) how the grants awarded under this section
10 serve the unique needs of American Indian or Alaska
11 Native veterans, elderly veterans, women veterans,
12 and veterans from other underserved communities;
13 and

14 "(C) other information provided by States and
15 Indian Tribes pursuant to the grant reporting re16 quirements.

17 "(k) PERFORMANCE REVIEW.—(1) The Secretary18 shall—

19 "(A) review the performance of each State or
20 Indian Tribe that receives a grant under this sec21 tion; and

22 "(B) make information regarding such perform-23 ance publicly available.

24 "(1) REMEDIATION PLAN.—(1) In the case of a State25 or Indian Tribe that receives a grant under this section

and does not meet the outcome measures developed by the
 Secretary under subsection (i), the Secretary shall require
 the State or Indian Tribe to submit a remediation plan
 under which the State or Indian Tribe shall describe how
 and when it plans to meet such outcome measures.

6 "(2) The Secretary may not award a subsequent 7 grant under this section to a State or Indian Tribe de-8 scribed in paragraph (1) unless the Secretary approves the 9 remediation plan submitted by the State of Indian Tribe. 10 "(m) MAXIMUM AMOUNT.—The amount of a grant

10 "(m) MAXIMUM AMOUNT.—The amount of a grant 11 awarded under this section may not exceed 10 percent of 12 amounts made available for grants under this section for 13 the fiscal year in which the grant is awarded.

14 "(n) SUPPLEMENT, NOT SUPPLANT.—Any grant
15 awarded under this section shall be used to supplement
16 and not supplant State and local funding that is otherwise
17 available.

18 "(o) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

19 "(1) The term 'county or Tribal veterans serv20 ice officer' includes a local equivalent veterans serv21 ice officer.

"(2) The term 'Indian Tribe' has the meaning
given such term in section 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25)
U.S.C. 5304).

1 "(3) The term 'State' includes the District of 2 Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, 3 4 and any territory or possession of the United States. "(4) The term 'Veterans Crisis Line' means the 5 6 toll-free hotline for veterans established under sec-7 tion 1720F(h) of this title.". 8 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections 9 at the beginning of chapter 63 of such title is amended 10 by striking the items relating to sections 6307 and 6308 and inserting the following new items: 11 "6307. Grants to States and Indian Tribes to improve outreach to veterans. "6308. Outreach for eligible dependents. "6309. Biennial report to Congress.". 12 (c)MODIFICATION OF CERTAIN HOUSING LOAN 13 FEE.—The loan fee table in section 3729(b)(2) of title 38, United States Code, is amended by striking "January 14, 14 15 2031" each place it appears and inserting "February 10,

16 2031".

(d) AUTHORIZATION OF ADDITIONAL FULL-TIME
EQUIVALENT EMPLOYEE.—During fiscal years 2024
through 2028, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs may hire
two or more additional full-time equivalent employees in
the Office of the General Counsel of the Department of
Veterans Affairs, as compared to the number of full-time
equivalent employees that would otherwise be authorized

1 for such office, to carry out duties under the accreditation,

2 discipline, and fees program.

# **3** SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

4 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of 5 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010, shall be determined by reference to the latest statement 6 titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation" for this 7 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record 8 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-9 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the 10 11 vote on passage.
