2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “National Guard and  
5 Reservists Debt Relief Extension Act of 2023”.

6 **SEC. 2. NATIONAL GUARD AND RESERVISTS DEBT RELIEF**  
7 **AMENDMENT.**

8       Section 4(b) of the National Guard and Reservists  
9 Debt Relief Act of 2008 (Public Law 110–438; 122 Stat.  
10 5000) is amended by striking “15-year” and inserting  
11 “19-year”.
