## A BILL

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Korean American Di-
- 5 vided Families National Registry Act".

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# 1SEC. 2. NATIONAL REGISTRY OF KOREAN AMERICAN DI-2VIDED FAMILIES.

3 The Secretary of State, acting through the Special
4 Envoy on North Korean Human Rights Issues or such
5 other individual as the Secretary may designate, shall—

6 (1) collate information on Korean American 7 families who wish to be reunited with family mem-8 bers in North Korea from which such Korean Amer-9 ican families were divided after the signing of the 10 Agreement Concerning a Military Armistice in 11 Korea, signed at Panmunjom July 27, 1953 (com-12 monly referred to as the "Korean War Armistice 13 Agreement"), in anticipation of future reunions for 14 such families and family members, including in-per-15 son and video reunions; and

16 (2) establish a private internal national registry
17 of the names and other relevant information of such
18 Korean American families—

19 (A) to host such future reunions in South
20 Korea, the United States, or third countries;
21 and

(B) to provide for a private internal repository of information about such Korean American families and family members in North
Korea, including information about individuals
who may be deceased.

### 1 SEC. 3. ACTIONS TO FACILITATE DIALOGUE BETWEEN THE 2 UNITED STATES AND NORTH KOREA.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State shall take
4 such actions as may be necessary to ensure that any direct
5 dialogue between the United States and North Korea in6 cludes progress towards holding future reunions for Ko7 rean American families and their family members in North
8 Korea as described in section 2.

9 (b) CONSULTATIONS.—The Secretary of State shall
10 consult with the Government of the Republic of Korea in
11 carrying out this section.

(c) REPORT.—No later than one year after enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter for 5 years, the
Secretary of State shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees a report on—

- 16 (1) the status of the national registry estab-17 lished pursuant to section 2(a)(2);
- 18 (2) the number of individuals included on the19 registry who—

20 (A) have met their family members in
21 North Korea during previous reunions; and
22 (B) have yet to meet their family members
23 in North Korea during previous reunions;
24 (3) a summary of responses by North Korea to
25 requests to hold reunions of divided families; and

(4) a description of regulations in North Korea
 and actions taken by North Korea in the year pre vious to submission of each report that prevent the
 emigration of family members of Korean American
 families.

6 (d) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES
7 DEFINED.—In this Act, "appropriate congressional com8 mittees" means the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
9 House of Representatives and the Committee on Foreign
10 Relations of the Senate.
