The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 405, by a record vote of 6 to 3, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 2240, the Improving Law Enforcement Officer Safety and Wellness Through Data Act, H.R. 2243, the LEOSA Reform Act, and H.R. 2255, the Federal Law Enforcement Officer Service Weapon Purchase Act of 2025, under closed rules. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of each bill. The resolution provides that the respective amendments in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on the Judiciary now printed in each bill shall be considered as adopted and each bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in each bill, as amended. The resolution provides one hour of general debate on each bill equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on the Judiciary or their respective designees. The resolution provides each bill one motion to recommit.
