A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish the Intelligence Rotational Assignment Program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “DHS Intelligence Ro-
5 tational Assignment Program and Law Enforcement Sup-
6 port Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY INTEL-**
2 **LIGENCE ROTATIONAL ASSIGNMENT PRO-**
3 **GRAM.**

4 Section 844 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
5 (6 U.S.C. 414) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6 lowing new subsection:

7 “(b) OFFICE OF THE DIRECTOR OF NATIONAL IN-
8 TELLIGENCE (ODNI) INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY CIVIL-
9 IAN JOINT DUTY PROGRAM.—The Secretary shall require
10 all components of the Department that are members of
11 the DHS Intelligence Enterprise to participate in the
12 ODNI Intelligence Community Civilian Joint Duty Pro-
13 gram in a manner consistent with the policies established
14 by the Director of National Intelligence for the Program.”.
