(The amendment strikes all after the enacting clause and inserts a new text)

Ms. SALINAS (for herself and Mr. McCORMICK) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology

A BILL

To amend the Research and Development, Competition, and Innovation Act to support nucleic acid screening, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited “Nucleic Acid Standards for
5 Biosecurity Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. SUPPORTING NUCLEIC ACID SCREENING.**

2 Section 10221 of the Research and Development,
3 Competition, and Innovation Act (42 U.S.C. 18931; en-
4 acted as part of title II of division B of Public Law 117–
5 167) is amended—

6 (1) in subsection (a)(1)—

7 (A) in subparagraph (C), by striking
8 “and” after the semicolon;

9 (B) by redesignating subparagraph (D) as
10 subparagraph (E); and

11 (C) by inserting after subparagraph (C)
12 the following new subparagraph:

13 “(D) best practices, guidelines, and tech-
14 nical standards for risk management associated
15 with engineering biology and biomanufacturing,
16 including risks associated with the use of artifi-
17 cial intelligence; and”;

18 (2) by redesignating subsections (b) and (c) as
19 subsections (c) and (d), respectively; and

20 (3) by inserting after subsection (a) the fol-
21 lowing new subsection:

22 “(b) NUCLEIC ACID SYNTHESIS SCREENING TOOLS
23 AND STANDARDS.—

24 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Director, in consulta-
25 tion with heads of Federal agencies the Director
26 considers appropriate, shall carry out measurement

1 research to support the development and improve-
2 ment of best practices and technical standards for
3 biosecurity measures related to nucleic acid syn-
4 thesis, including the following:

5 “(A) Testing to improve the accuracy, effi-
6 cacy, and reliability of screening for nucleic acid
7 synthesis.

8 “(B) Best practices, including security and
9 access controls, for operational security and
10 managing sequence-of-concern databases to
11 support such screening.

12 “(C) Technical implementation guidance to
13 ensure such screening is effective and secure.

14 “(D) Conformity-assessment best practices
15 and technical standards.

16 “(E) Methods to evaluate the impact and
17 effectiveness of the implementation of subpara-
18 graphs (A) through (D).

19 “(2) CONSORTIUM.—In carrying out this sub-
20 section, the Director shall convene a consortium of
21 stakeholders, including industry, institutions of high-
22 er education, nonprofit organizations, and customers
23 to carry out the following:

24 “(A) Develop and periodically update con-
25 sensus priorities and best practices, as appro-

1 priate, for synthetic nucleic acid procurement
2 screening mechanisms.

3 “(B) Develop roadmaps to inform the ac-
4 tivities carried out under paragraph (1).

5 “(3) REPORT.—Not later than 18 months after
6 the first meeting of the consortium under paragraph
7 (2), the Director shall submit to the Committee on
8 Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Sen-
9 ate and the Committee on Science, Space, and Tech-
10 nology of the House of Representatives a report
11 summarizing the findings of the consortium.

12 “(4) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—Of
13 the funds authorized to be appropriated for the Na-
14 tional Institute of Standards and Technology pursu-
15 ant to this section for scientific and technical re-
16 search and services laboratory activities, there is au-
17 thorized to be appropriated \$5,000,000 for each of
18 fiscal years 2027 through 2031 to carry out this
19 subsection.”.
