Assistant Inspector General for Analytics and Innovation

Jenny Rone is the Assistant Inspector General for Analytics and Innovation, Office of Inspector General (OIG), U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). In this capacity, Ms. Rone leads efforts to modernize the way OIG does business using data and analytics to transform oversight and operations.

Ms. Rone formerly served in several positions at the U.S. Department of the Treasury's Bureau of Fiscal Service including Deputy Assistant Commissioner for Debt Management Services and Executive Director of the Do Not Pay program. Her final position was as the Acting Assistant Commissioner for Debt Management Services overseeing a staff of 450 and collecting more than \$7.5 billion in Federal delinquent debt.

Ms. Rone has an extensive history with the Federal oversight community beginning with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) Office of Inspector General. During her 7-year tenure at HHS OIG, Ms. Rone managed a number of key responsibilities including serving as Special Assistant to the Inspector General and as the office's first Chief Information Officer/Information Resources Management director.

Ms. Rone was later an independent contractor/consultant to the IG community developing and maintaining the Council for the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency's website and providing business process and system redesign services for both the audit and investigations functions at various OIGs. In 2012, Ms. Rone rejoined the Federal government and served as the Assistant Director for Data and Performance Metrics at the Recovery Accountability and Transparency Board.

During her hiatus from Federal Service, Ms. Rone built and owned two successful retail businesses, owned a theater company jointly with her husband, and built a 12,000 square foot community arts center in Beaufort, SC while serving on the staff of a non-profit arts organization as the director of development.

Ms. Rone received a B.A. in Biology from Albion College in Albion, Michigan in 1984.
