



## ALASKA NATIVE TRIBAL HEALTH CONSORTIUM

Andy Teuber serves as the Chairman and President of the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC); a position he has held since 2008. Teuber has also served as the President and CEO of the Kodiak Area Native Association (KANA) since 2006. He is an enrolled member of Tangirnaq Native Village (a federally recognized tribe). He holds a Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Washington.



In addition to his administrative positions, Andy operates Kodiak Helicopters, LLC in Kodiak. He is active in the community and serves on a number of boards that include: University of Alaska Board of Regents, Alaska Federation of Natives, Alaska Community Foundation, Alaska Airlines Community Advisory Board, Alaska Chamber of Commerce, and the Tangirnaq Council.

The Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium is a non-profit Tribal health organization. The Consortium is the largest, most comprehensive Tribal health organization in the United States, and Alaska's second-largest health employer with more than 3,000 employees offering an array of health services to people around the nation's largest state. The Consortium has four operating divisions: Alaska Native Medical Center (ANMC), Community Health Services, Environmental Health & Engineering, and Business Support. Its largest division, ANMC, is a 167-bed hospital and provides specialty and tertiary care hospital to indigenous people of Alaska, spanning distances equivalent to two-thirds of the United States. The Kodiak Area Native Association is a non-profit corporation providing health and social services for the Alaska Natives of Kodiak Island. KANA provides services to the City of Kodiak and six rural villages only accessible by boat or plane. Services provided include an ambulatory medical care, dental care, pharmacy, contract health (purchased health services), Community Health Aide Program, substance abuse prevention, non-clinical community health and youth prevention projects.
