

Douglas Cox is the Chairman of the Menominee Tribe in 2018. He has served as a Tribal Legislator of the Menominee Tribal Legislature since 2016. Chairman Cox is an enrolled tribal member of the Menominee Tribe, and is a life-long resident of the Menominee Reservation Community.

Douglas has worked for the Tribe for the past 27 years, in the environmental and natural resource management departments, serving as Environmental Program Coordinator, Forest Monitoring Specialist, and Forest Ecologist. He has extensive experience in environmental protection, including in water quality standards, environmental regulatory management, and resource management planning. Chairman Cox has been an active and effective advocate for his Tribe on both a local, state, and national level. Chairman Cox represent his tribal community with his involvement in regulations and legislation affecting the Tribe and Indian Country, through is service on the EPA's National Tribal Caucus and Region 5 Tribal Operations Committee, addressing tribal environmental issues.

Douglas holds a BAS degree with emphasis in Biology and minor in Environmental Science from the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay.
