


Harold C. Frazier



Curriculum Vitae

Chairman Harold Frazier was born and raised in White Horse, South Dakota and comes from Chief White Horse, Chief War Eagle, and Chief White Swan tiospaye (family). Chairman Frazier earned his Associate Degree in Agricultural Business from Eastern Wyoming College and his Bachelor Degree in Business Management from Oglala Lakota College. Chairman Frazier's political career first began in 1998 when he was elected to serve on Tribal Council. In 2002, he was elected to serve (4 year term) as Chairman for Cheyenne River where he went on to serve as the Great Plains Area Vice-President for NCAI and was honorary Sergeant at Arms for the 2004 Democratic Convention. In 2014, he was elected again (4 year term) by the people and also elected to serve as the Great Plains Tribal Chairman's Association Chairman.

In 2016, for the first time in history, Chairman Frazier delivered the first ever State of Indian Nations Address at the joint session of the South Dakota Legislature. Shortly after, he stood at the forefront of protecting the Great Sioux Nation homelands from the Dakota Access Pipeline and impending Keystone XL project. Chairman Frazier works tirelessly to protect indigenous natural resources and preserve treaty rights. His leadership in the fight to stop Dakota Access Pipeline and Energy Transfers Company brought a world-wide unified front to South Dakota.
