Chairman, Shoshone-Bannock Tribes

Chairman Nathan Small has been serving on the Fort Hall Business Council, the governing body of the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes, located on the Fort Hall Reservation in southeastern Idaho off and on since the late 1980's as a Council Member and currently as Chairman. Chairman Small was instrumental in opening the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes' first gaming operation and served as gaming manager from 1990 to 1998. He has been a member of the Shoshone-Bannock Tribal Bar Association since 1980 and has held positions as both a prosecutor and public defender in the Shoshone-Bannock Tribal Courts.

Chairman Small also worked for a time in the Tribal Water Resources Department and the Environmental Waste Program advocating for protection of clean environmental resources. Small is also an original founding Board Member of the COLT (Coalition of Large Tribes) organization, which promotes the sovereign rights of tribes and currently serves as the Interim COLT Treasurer.

He is an avid fisherman and always enjoys traveling with his family to central Idaho each summer to spear salmon in the traditional way of our people.
