

Kasey Shewey White is a leader in science policy, with extensive experience in climate change, energy and environmental policy, and science communication. Kasey joined The Geological Society of America in December 2011 as Director for Geoscience Policy. In this role, Kasey leads GSA efforts to influence policy on behalf of its 22,000 members. She previously worked in government relations at the American Association for the Advancement of Science, American Geosciences Institute, and Joint Oceanographic Institutions. She previously served as a co-editor of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) report *Climate Change 2001: Impacts, Adaptation, and Vulnerability* and was lead author of the Technical Summary of the report, which was awarded a share of the 2007 Nobel Peace Prize. She holds a BS in Environment Science and Policy from Duke University and a MS in Environmental Sciences from The Johns Hopkins University.
