Diane Hoskins is a campaign director at Oceana, the largest international advocacy organization dedicated to ocean conservation. With a background in national legislative policy campaigns, external affairs and lobbying, Hoskins leads Oceana's campaign to prevent the expansion of offshore drilling and exploration off the coasts of the United States. Before joining Oceana in August 2017, Hoskins worked for The Pew Charitable Trusts where she directed a winning campaign to reform the Army Corps of Engineers' Nationwide Permit program. Prior to Pew, she worked as external affairs and government relations director for Restore America's Estuaries. Earlier in her career, Hoskins held multiple roles at The Nature Conservancy on their Climate Change, Federal Legislative Campaigns and EcoEnterprises Fund teams. She also was a program manager with the District Department of Environment, spent a year as an AmeriCorps volunteer and worked for a microfinance organization in West Africa. A DC-area native, politics has always been close to home and Hoskins has worked on several state and national campaigns. Hoskins graduated summa cum laude from the University of Maryland with a B.S. in Resource Economics.
