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Dr. Linsey Haram is a marine ecologist, who studies the impacts of invasive species introductions on natural ecosystems. She is currently a postdoctoral research fellow in the Marine Invasions Research Lab at the Smithsonian Environmental Research Center. As part of a NASA-funded multi-institutional collaboration among marine ecologists, oceanographers, and non-profits, she studies the effects of plastic marine debris on transport and invasions of non-native species in the ocean. Dr. Haram also studies the development of ecological communities on offshore artificial structures within an international network of universities and governmental agencies. She received her Ph.D. from the Odum School of Ecology at the University of Georgia, where she studied the effects of an invasive seaweed on food webs in southeastern coastal ecosystems. She also received a Bachelor of Arts from Middlebury College with a joint degree in Environmental Studies and Biology.
