Jamie Henio currently serves on the 24th Navajo Nation Council and represents the Navajo sub-political units/Chapters of Alamo, Ramah and To'hajilee. He is a lifelong member of the Ramah Navajo Community and a direct descendent of leaders. He has been given the opportunity to put his leadership skills to use and make a positive impact for the Ramah Navajo People. The trust that was placed on him by the people was overwhelming with support.

Jamie Henio's professional background is (1) Mr. Henio served as the Ramah Navajo Chapter/Ramah Band of Navajo Vice-President for 2 years. 2) Mr. Henio was previously employed by the Navajo Nation Legislative Branch as a Policy Analyst for the Office of Navajo Government Development for 5 years. (3) Mr. Henio is member in good standing with the Navajo Nation Bar Association which allows him to practice law on the Navajo Nation. (4) He is a former prosecutor with the Navajo Department of Justice. (5) He worked as a Housing Director for the Navajo Housing Authority for approximately 13 years prior to working for the Navajo Nation. (6) He is a former police officer for the Ramah Navajo Police Department for seven years.

Education: He is a high school graduate. He graduated with honors from Navajo Technical College now better known as Navajo Technical University and became the first NTC graduate to pass the Navajo Nation bar exam.
