Dr. Mark LeBeau, Chief Executive Officer at the California Rural Indian Health Board, Inc. is a citizen of the Pit River Nation. He has worked at CRIHB since 1999 in numerous capacities, including as a public Health Programs Manager, Proposal Writer, Director of the annual Traditional Indian Health Gathering, Health Education Specialist, and the Health Policy Analyst for nearly a decade. He earned a doctorate degree from UC Davis (UCD), with a dissertation focus on the implications of government policies on the health and health care systems of Indigenous peoples in California. He also holds a UCD Master of Science degree, with a thesis focus of culturally appropriate public health programming in Tribal communities, and a bachelor's degree from Humboldt State University.

Dr. LeBeau has served on the Pit River Election Committee Pit River Health Services Board of Directors, and as a Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation Congressional Fellow in Washington, DC, working on American Indian/Alaska Native legislative initiatives to benefit Indian country. He has been a Member of the State of California Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission Community Services and Supports Committee and Tribal Cultural Site Bill Drafting Workgroup, as well as the Federal Advisory Council on Historic Preservation. He is currently a Member of the Federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Service Tribal Technical Advisory Group, Chair of the Group's Data Committee, and an organizer of CRIHB's advocacy and legislative initiatives in Washington, DC and Sacramento, CA.
