

Brittany L. Hott, Ph.D., BCBA-D

Biography

Dr. Brittany L. Hott is an associate professor of special education and associate director of the Institute for Community and Society Transformation (ICAST) at the University of Oklahoma. She is a certified special education teacher and board certified behavior analyst with doctoral distinction (BCBA-D). Over the last 23 years, Dr. Hott has served as a special education teacher, instructional leader, teacher educator, and researcher. Her work focuses on instructional methods for rural students with learning and behavioral disabilities, assessment and evaluation in rural education, and the translation of special education research to rural practice.

Dr. Hott's publication record includes 3 books, 46 peer reviewed articles, 15 book chapters, 17 program evaluations, and numerous technical assistance documents. She has delivered over 100 conference and professional development presentations. Dr. Hott's recent work appears in the *Journal of Special Education*, *Behavior Modification*, *Rural Special Education Quarterly*, and *Learning Disability Quarterly*. Dr. Hott is the recipient of the American Council on Rural Special Education's 2021 Research and Evaluation Award and is an active member of the special education community. She is currently serving as co-chair of the Council for Exceptional Children's Publications Committee and is a past president of the International Council for Learning Disabilities.
