Making appropriations for military construction, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, and for other purposes.

8 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, NAVY AND MARINE CORPS

9 For acquisition, construction, installation, and equip-
10 ment of temporary or permanent public works, naval in-
11 stallations, facilities, and real property for the Navy and
12 Marine Corps as currently authorized by law, including
13 personnel in the Naval Facilities Engineering Command
14 and other personal services necessary for the purposes of
15 this appropriation, \$4,567,961,000, to remain available
16 until September 30, 2028: *Provided*, That, of this amount,
17 not to exceed \$602,625,000 shall be available for study,
18 planning, design, and architect and engineer services, as
19 authorized by law, unless the Secretary of the Navy deter-
20 mines that additional obligations are necessary for such
21 purposes and notifies the Committees on Appropriations
22 of both Houses of Congress of the determination and the
23 reasons therefor: *Provided further*, That of the amount
24 made available under this heading, \$52,683,000 shall be
25 for the projects and activities, and in the amounts, speci-

1 fied in the table under the heading “Military Construction,
2 Navy and Marine Corps” in the report accompanying this
3 Act, in addition to amounts otherwise available for such
4 purposes.

5 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, AIR FORCE

6 For acquisition, construction, installation, and equip-
7 ment of temporary or permanent public works, military
8 installations, facilities, and real property for the Air Force
9 as currently authorized by law, \$2,439,614,000, to remain
10 available until September 30, 2028: *Provided*, That, of this
11 amount, not to exceed \$450,614,000 shall be available for
12 study, planning, design, and architect and engineer serv-
13 ices, as authorized by law, unless the Secretary of the Air
14 Force determines that additional obligations are necessary
15 for such purposes and notifies the Committees on Appro-
16 priations of both Houses of Congress of the determination
17 and the reasons therefor: *Provided further*, That of the
18 amount made available under this heading, \$30,300,000
19 shall be for the projects and activities, and in the amounts,
20 specified in the table under the heading “Military Con-
21 struction, Air Force” in the report accompanying this Act,
22 in addition to amounts otherwise available for such pur-
23 poses.

1 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, DEFENSE-WIDE
2 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

3 For acquisition, construction, installation, and equip-
4 ment of temporary or permanent public works, installa-
5 tions, facilities, and real property for activities and agen-
6 cies of the Department of Defense (other than the military
7 departments), as currently authorized by law,
8 \$2,665,047,000, to remain available until September 30,
9 2028: *Provided*, That such amounts of this appropriation
10 as may be determined by the Secretary of Defense may
11 be transferred to such appropriations of the Department
12 of Defense available for military construction or family
13 housing as the Secretary may designate, to be merged with
14 and to be available for the same purposes, and for the
15 same time period, as the appropriation or fund to which
16 transferred: *Provided further*, That, of the amount, not to
17 exceed \$308,045,000 shall be available for study, plan-
18 ning, design, and architect and engineer services, as au-
19 thorized by law, unless the Secretary of Defense deter-
20 mines that additional obligations are necessary for such
21 purposes and notifies the Committees on Appropriations
22 of both Houses of Congress of the determination and the
23 reasons therefor.

1 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

2 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
3 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
4 ministration of the Army National Guard, and contribu-
5 tions therefor, as authorized by chapter 1803 of title 10,
6 United States Code, and Military Construction Authoriza-
7 tion Acts, \$369,261,000, to remain available until Sep-
8 tember 30, 2028: *Provided*, That, of the amount, not to
9 exceed \$42,361,000 shall be available for study, planning,
10 design, and architect and engineer services, as authorized
11 by law, unless the Director of the Army National Guard
12 determines that additional obligations are necessary for
13 such purposes and notifies the Committees on Appropria-
14 tions of both Houses of Congress of the determination and
15 the reasons therefor: *Provided further*, That of the amount
16 made available under this heading, \$19,075,000 shall be
17 for the projects and activities, and in the amounts, speci-
18 fied in the table under the heading “Military Construction,
19 Army National Guard” in the report accompanying this
20 Act, in addition to amounts otherwise available for such
21 purposes.

22 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, AIR NATIONAL GUARD

23 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
24 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
25 ministration of the Air National Guard, and contributions

1 therefor, as authorized by chapter 1803 of title 10, United
2 States Code, and Military Construction Authorization
3 Acts, \$189,322,000, to remain available until September
4 30, 2028: *Provided*, That, of the amount, not to exceed
5 \$36,200,000 shall be available for study, planning, design,
6 and architect and engineer services, as authorized by law,
7 unless the Director of the Air National Guard determines
8 that additional obligations are necessary for such purposes
9 and notifies the Committees on Appropriations of both
10 Houses of Congress of the determination and the reasons
11 therefor: *Provided further*, That of the amount made avail-
12 able under this heading, \$600,000 shall be for the projects
13 and activities, and in the amounts, specified in the table
14 under the heading “Military Construction, Air National
15 Guard” in the report accompanying this Act, in addition
16 to amounts otherwise available for such purposes.

17 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, ARMY RESERVE

18 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
19 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
20 ministration of the Army Reserve as authorized by chapter
21 1803 of title 10, United States Code, and Military Con-
22 struction Authorization Acts, \$117,076,000, to remain
23 available until September 30, 2028: *Provided*, That, of the
24 amount, not to exceed \$23,389,000 shall be available for
25 study, planning, design, and architect and engineer serv-

1 ices, as authorized by law, unless the Chief of the Army
2 Reserve determines that additional obligations are nec-
3 essary for such purposes and notifies the Committees on
4 Appropriations of both Houses of Congress of the deter-
5 mination and the reasons therefor.

6 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, NAVY RESERVE

7 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
8 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
9 ministration of the reserve components of the Navy and
10 Marine Corps as authorized by chapter 1803 of title 10,
11 United States Code, and Military Construction Authoriza-
12 tion Acts, \$61,291,000, to remain available until Sep-
13 tember 30, 2028: *Provided*, That, of the amount, not to
14 exceed \$6,495,000 shall be available for study, planning,
15 design, and architect and engineer services, as authorized
16 by law, unless the Secretary of the Navy determines that
17 additional obligations are necessary for such purposes and
18 notifies the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses
19 of Congress of the determination and the reasons therefor.

20 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, AIR FORCE RESERVE

21 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
22 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
23 ministration of the Air Force Reserve as authorized by
24 chapter 1803 of title 10, United States Code, and Military
25 Construction Authorization Acts, \$179,572,000, to remain

1 available until September 30, 2028: *Provided*, That, of the
2 amount, not to exceed \$12,146,000 shall be available for
3 study, planning, design, and architect and engineer serv-
4 ices, as authorized by law, unless the Chief of the Air
5 Force Reserve determines that additional obligations are
6 necessary for such purposes and notifies the Committees
7 on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress of the de-
8 termination and the reasons therefor: *Provided further*,
9 That of the amount made available under this heading,
10 \$29,000,000 shall be for the projects and activities, and
11 in the amounts, specified in the table under the heading
12 “Military Construction, Air Force Reserve” in the report
13 accompanying this Act, in addition to amounts otherwise
14 available for such purposes.

15 NORTH ATLANTIC TREATY ORGANIZATION

16 SECURITY INVESTMENT PROGRAM

17 For the United States share of the cost of the North
18 Atlantic Treaty Organization Security Investment Pro-
19 gram for the acquisition and construction of military fa-
20 cilities and installations (including international military
21 headquarters) and for related expenses for the collective
22 defense of the North Atlantic Treaty Area as authorized
23 by section 2806 of title 10, United States Code, and Mili-
24 tary Construction Authorization Acts, \$293,434,000, to
25 remain available until expended.

1 DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE BASE CLOSURE ACCOUNT

2 For deposit into the Department of Defense Base
3 Closure Account, established by section 2906(a) of the De-
4 fense Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1990 (10
5 U.S.C. 2687 note), \$539,174,000, to remain available
6 until expended.

7 FAMILY HOUSING CONSTRUCTION, ARMY

8 For expenses of family housing for the Army for con-
9 struction, including acquisition, replacement, addition, ex-
10 pansion, extension, and alteration, as authorized by law,
11 \$304,895,000, to remain available until September 30,
12 2028.

13 FAMILY HOUSING OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE,

14 ARMY

15 For expenses of family housing for the Army for op-
16 eration and maintenance, including debt payment, leasing,
17 minor construction, principal and interest charges, and in-
18 surance premiums, as authorized by law, \$385,485,000.

19 FAMILY HOUSING CONSTRUCTION, NAVY AND MARINE

20 CORPS

21 For expenses of family housing for the Navy and Ma-
22 rine Corps for construction, including acquisition, replace-
23 ment, addition, expansion, extension, and alteration, as
24 authorized by law, \$277,142,000, to remain available until
25 September 30, 2028.

1 leasing, and minor construction, as authorized by law,
2 \$50,785,000.

3 DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE

4 FAMILY HOUSING IMPROVEMENT FUND

5 For the Department of Defense Family Housing Im-
6 provement Fund, \$6,611,000, to remain available until ex-
7 pended, for family housing initiatives undertaken pursu-
8 ant to section 2883 of title 10, United States Code, pro-
9 viding alternative means of acquiring and improving mili-
10 tary family housing and supporting facilities.

11 DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE

12 MILITARY UNACCOMPANIED HOUSING IMPROVEMENT

13 FUND

14 For the Department of Defense Military Unaccom-
15 panied Housing Improvement Fund, \$496,000, to remain
16 available until expended, for unaccompanied housing ini-
17 tiatives undertaken pursuant to section 2883 of title 10,
18 United States Code, providing alternative means of acquir-
19 ing and improving military unaccompanied housing and
20 supporting facilities.

21 ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

22 SEC. 101. None of the funds made available in this
23 title shall be expended for payments under a cost-plus-a-
24 fixed-fee contract for construction, where cost estimates
25 exceed \$25,000, to be performed within the United States,

1 except Alaska, without the specific approval in writing of
2 the Secretary of Defense setting forth the reasons there-
3 for.

4 SEC. 102. Funds made available in this title for con-
5 struction shall be available for hire of passenger motor ve-
6 hicles.

7 SEC. 103. Funds made available in this title for con-
8 struction may be used for advances to the Federal High-
9 way Administration, Department of Transportation, for
10 the construction of access roads as authorized by section
11 210 of title 23, United States Code, when projects author-
12 ized therein are certified as important to the national de-
13 fense by the Secretary of Defense.

14 SEC. 104. None of the funds made available in this
15 title may be used to begin construction of new bases in
16 the United States for which specific appropriations have
17 not been made.

18 SEC. 105. None of the funds made available in this
19 title shall be used for purchase of land or land easements
20 in excess of 100 percent of the value as determined by
21 the Army Corps of Engineers or the Naval Facilities Engi-
22 neering Command, except: (1) where there is a determina-
23 tion of value by a Federal court; (2) purchases negotiated
24 by the Attorney General or the designee of the Attorney
25 General; (3) where the estimated value is less than

1 \$25,000; or (4) as otherwise determined by the Secretary
2 of Defense to be in the public interest.

3 SEC. 106. None of the funds made available in this
4 title shall be used to: (1) acquire land; (2) provide for site
5 preparation; or (3) install utilities for any family housing,
6 except housing for which funds have been made available
7 in annual Acts making appropriations for military con-
8 struction.

9 SEC. 107. None of the funds made available in this
10 title for minor construction may be used to transfer or
11 relocate any activity from one base or installation to an-
12 other, without prior notification to the Committees on Ap-
13 propriations of both Houses of Congress.

14 SEC. 108. None of the funds made available in this
15 title may be used for the procurement of steel for any con-
16 struction project or activity for which American steel pro-
17 ducers, fabricators, and manufacturers have been denied
18 the opportunity to compete for such steel procurement.

19 SEC. 109. None of the funds available to the Depart-
20 ment of Defense for military construction or family hous-
21 ing during the current fiscal year may be used to pay real
22 property taxes in any foreign nation.

23 SEC. 110. None of the funds made available in this
24 title may be used to initiate a new installation overseas

1 without prior notification to the Committees on Appro-
2 priations of both Houses of Congress.

3 SEC. 111. None of the funds made available in this
4 title may be obligated for architect and engineer contracts
5 estimated by the Government to exceed \$500,000 for
6 projects to be accomplished in Japan, in any North Atlan-
7 tic Treaty Organization member country, or in countries
8 bordering the Arabian Gulf, unless such contracts are
9 awarded to United States firms or United States firms
10 in joint venture with host nation firms.

11 SEC. 112. None of the funds made available in this
12 title for military construction in the United States terri-
13 tories and possessions in the Pacific and on Kwajalein
14 Atoll, or in countries bordering the Arabian Gulf, may be
15 used to award any contract estimated by the Government
16 to exceed \$1,000,000 to a foreign contractor: *Provided*,
17 That this section shall not be applicable to contract
18 awards for which the lowest responsive and responsible bid
19 of a United States contractor exceeds the lowest respon-
20 sive and responsible bid of a foreign contractor by greater
21 than 20 percent: *Provided further*, That this section shall
22 not apply to contract awards for military construction on
23 Kwajalein Atoll for which the lowest responsive and re-
24 sponsible bid is submitted by a Marshallese contractor.

1 SEC. 113. The Secretary of Defense shall inform the
2 appropriate committees of both Houses of Congress, in-
3 cluding the Committees on Appropriations, of plans and
4 scope of any proposed military exercise involving United
5 States personnel 30 days prior to its occurring, if amounts
6 expended for construction, either temporary or permanent,
7 are anticipated to exceed \$100,000.

8 SEC. 114. Funds appropriated to the Department of
9 Defense for construction in prior years shall be available
10 for construction authorized for each such military depart-
11 ment by the authorizations enacted into law during the
12 current session of Congress.

13 SEC. 115. For military construction or family housing
14 projects that are being completed with funds otherwise ex-
15 pired or lapsed for obligation, expired or lapsed funds may
16 be used to pay the cost of associated supervision, inspec-
17 tion, overhead, engineering and design on those projects
18 and on subsequent claims, if any.

19 SEC. 116. Notwithstanding any other provision of
20 law, any funds made available to a military department
21 or defense agency for the construction of military projects
22 may be obligated for a military construction project or
23 contract, or for any portion of such a project or contract,
24 at any time before the end of the fourth fiscal year after
25 the fiscal year for which funds for such project were made

1 available, if the funds obligated for such project: (1) are
2 obligated from funds available for military construction
3 projects; and (2) do not exceed the amount appropriated
4 for such project, plus any amount by which the cost of
5 such project is increased pursuant to law.

6 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

7 SEC. 117. Subject to 30 days prior notification, or
8 14 days for a notification provided in an electronic me-
9 dium pursuant to sections 480 and 2883 of title 10,
10 United States Code, to the Committees on Appropriations
11 of both Houses of Congress, such additional amounts as
12 may be determined by the Secretary of Defense may be
13 transferred to: (1) the Department of Defense Family
14 Housing Improvement Fund from amounts appropriated
15 for construction in “Family Housing” accounts, to be
16 merged with and to be available for the same purposes
17 and for the same period of time as amounts appropriated
18 directly to the Fund; or (2) the Department of Defense
19 Military Unaccompanied Housing Improvement Fund
20 from amounts appropriated for construction of military
21 unaccompanied housing in “Military Construction” ac-
22 counts, to be merged with and to be available for the same
23 purposes and for the same period of time as amounts ap-
24 propriated directly to the Fund: *Provided*, That appropria-
25 tions made available to the Funds shall be available to

1 cover the costs, as defined in section 502(5) of the Con-
2 gressional Budget Act of 1974, of direct loans or loan
3 guarantees issued by the Department of Defense pursuant
4 to the provisions of subchapter IV of chapter 169 of title
5 10, United States Code, pertaining to alternative means
6 of acquiring and improving military family housing, mili-
7 tary unaccompanied housing, and supporting facilities.

8 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

9 SEC. 118. In addition to any other transfer authority
10 available to the Department of Defense, amounts may be
11 transferred from the Department of Defense Base Closure
12 Account to the fund established by section 1013(d) of the
13 Demonstration Cities and Metropolitan Development Act
14 of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 3374) to pay for expenses associated
15 with the Homeowners Assistance Program incurred under
16 42 U.S.C. 3374(a)(1)(A). Any amounts transferred shall
17 be merged with and be available for the same purposes
18 and for the same time period as the fund to which trans-
19 ferred.

20 SEC. 119. Notwithstanding any other provision of
21 law, funds made available in this title for operation and
22 maintenance of family housing shall be the exclusive
23 source of funds for repair and maintenance of all family
24 housing units, including general or flag officer quarters:
25 *Provided*, That not more than \$15,000 per unit may be

1 spent annually for the maintenance and repair of any gen-
2 eral or flag officer quarters without 30 days prior notifica-
3 tion, or 14 days for a notification provided in an electronic
4 medium pursuant to sections 480 and 2883 of title 10,
5 United States Code, to the Committees on Appropriations
6 of both Houses of Congress, except that an after-the-fact
7 notification shall be submitted if the limitation is exceeded
8 solely due to costs associated with environmental remedi-
9 ation that could not be reasonably anticipated at the time
10 of the budget submission: *Provided further*, That the
11 Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller) is to report an-
12 nually to the Committees on Appropriations of both
13 Houses of Congress all operation and maintenance ex-
14 penditures for each individual general or flag officer quar-
15 ters for the prior fiscal year.

16 SEC. 120. Amounts contained in the Ford Island Im-
17 provement Account established by subsection (h) of sec-
18 tion 2814 of title 10, United States Code, are appro-
19 priated and shall be available until expended for the pur-
20 poses specified in subsection (i)(1) of such section or until
21 transferred pursuant to subsection (i)(3) of such section.

22 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

23 SEC. 121. During the 5-year period after appropria-
24 tions available in this Act to the Department of Defense
25 for military construction and family housing operation and

1 maintenance and construction have expired for obligation,
2 upon a determination that such appropriations will not be
3 necessary for the liquidation of obligations or for making
4 authorized adjustments to such appropriations for obliga-
5 tions incurred during the period of availability of such ap-
6 propriations, unobligated balances of such appropriations
7 may be transferred into the appropriation “Foreign Cur-
8 rency Fluctuations, Construction, Defense”, to be merged
9 with and to be available for the same time period and for
10 the same purposes as the appropriation to which trans-
11 ferred.

12 SEC. 122. Amounts appropriated or otherwise made
13 available in an account funded under the headings in this
14 title may be transferred among projects and activities
15 within the account in accordance with the reprogramming
16 guidelines for military construction and family housing
17 construction contained in Department of Defense Finan-
18 cial Management Regulation 7000.14–R, Volume 3, Chap-
19 ter 7, of March 2011, as in effect on the date of enactment
20 of this Act.

21 SEC. 123. None of the funds made available in this
22 title may be obligated or expended for planning and design
23 and construction of projects at Arlington National Ceme-
24 tery.

1 SEC. 124. For an additional amount for the accounts
2 and in the amounts specified, to remain available until
3 September 30, 2028:

4 “Military Construction, Army”, \$104,100,000;

5 “Military Construction, Navy and Marine
6 Corps”, \$689,409,000;

7 “Military Construction, Air Force”,
8 \$328,300,000;

9 “Military Construction, Defense-Wide”,
10 \$280,100,000;

11 “Military Construction, Army National Guard”,
12 \$10,400,000;

13 “Military Construction, Air National Guard”,
14 \$153,742,000;

15 “Military Construction, Air Force Reserve”,
16 \$8,500,000; and

17 “Family Housing Construction, Air Force”,
18 \$27,000,000:

19 *Provided*, That such funds may only be obligated to carry
20 out construction projects identified in the respective mili-
21 tary department’s unfunded priority list for fiscal year
22 2024 submitted to Congress: *Provided further*, That such
23 projects are subject to authorization prior to obligation
24 and expenditure of funds to carry out construction: *Pro-*
25 *vided further*, That not later than 60 days after enactment

1 of this Act, the Secretary of the military department con-
2 cerned, or their designee, shall submit to the Committees
3 on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress an expendi-
4 ture plan for funds provided under this section.

5 SEC. 125. All amounts appropriated to the “Depart-
6 ment of Defense—Military Construction, Army”, “De-
7 partment of Defense—Military Construction, Navy and
8 Marine Corps”, “Department of Defense—Military Con-
9 struction, Air Force”, and “Department of Defense—Mili-
10 tary Construction, Defense-Wide” accounts pursuant to
11 the authorization of appropriations in a National Defense
12 Authorization Act specified for fiscal year 2024 in the
13 funding table in section 4601 of that Act shall be imme-
14 diately available and allotted to contract for the full scope
15 of authorized projects.

16 SEC. 126. Notwithstanding section 116 of this Act,
17 funds made available in this Act or any available unobli-
18 gated balances from prior appropriations Acts may be obli-
19 gated before October 1, 2025, for fiscal year 2017, 2018,
20 and 2019 military construction projects for which project
21 authorization has not lapsed or for which authorization
22 is extended for fiscal year 2024 by a National Defense
23 Authorization Act: *Provided*, That no amounts may be ob-
24 ligated pursuant to this section from amounts that were
25 designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement

1 pursuant to a concurrent resolution on the budget or the
2 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
3 1985.

4 SEC. 127. For the purposes of this Act, the term
5 “congressional defense committees” means the Commit-
6 tees on Armed Services of the House of Representatives
7 and the Senate, the Subcommittee on Military Construc-
8 tion and Veterans Affairs of the Committee on Appropria-
9 tions of the Senate, and the Subcommittee on Military
10 Construction and Veterans Affairs of the Committee on
11 Appropriations of the House of Representatives.

12 SEC. 128. For an additional amount for the accounts
13 and in the amounts specified for planning and design and
14 for construction improvements to Department of Defense
15 laboratory facilities, to remain available until September
16 30, 2028:

17 “Military Construction, Army”, \$30,000,000;

18 “Military Construction, Navy and Marine
19 Corps”, \$30,000,000; and

20 “Military Construction, Air Force”,
21 \$30,000,000:

22 *Provided*, That not later than 60 days after enactment of
23 this Act, the Secretary of the military department con-
24 cerned, or their designee, shall submit to the Committees
25 on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress an expendi-

1 ture plan for funds provided under this section: *Provided*
2 *further*, That the Secretary of the military department
3 concerned may not obligate or expend any funds prior to
4 approval by the Committees on Appropriations of both
5 Houses of Congress of the expenditure plan required by
6 this section.

7 SEC. 129. For an additional amount for “Military
8 Construction, Air Force”, \$252,000,000, to remain avail-
9 able until September 30, 2028, for expenses incurred as
10 a result of natural disasters: *Provided*, That not later than
11 60 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-
12 retary of the Air Force, or their designee, shall submit
13 to the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of

12 of title 38, United States Code; \$2,277,955,000, which

3 asset acquisition of information technology systems, in-
4 cluding management and related contractual costs of said
5 acquisitions, including contractual costs associated with
6 operations authorized by section 3109 of title 5, United
7 States Code, \$6,401,000,000, plus reimbursements: *Pro-*
8 *vided*, That \$1,606,977,000 shall be for pay and associ-
9 ated costs, of which not to exceed 3 percent shall remain
10 available until September 30, 2025: *Provided further*, That
11 \$4,668,373,000 shall be for operations and maintenance,
12 of which not to exceed 5 percent shall remain available
13 until September 30, 2025: *Provided further*, That
14 \$125,650,000 shall be for information technology systems
15 development, and shall remain available until September
16 30, 2025: *Provided further*, That amounts made available
17 for salaries and expenses, operations and maintenance,
18 and information technology systems development may be
19 transferred among the three subaccounts after the Sec-
20 retary of Veterans Affairs requests from the Committees
21 on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress the author-
22 ity to make the transfer and an approval is issued: *Pro-*

5 Affairs, including planning and assessments of needs
6 which may lead to capital investments, architectural and
7 engineering services, maintenance or guarantee period
8 services costs associated with equipment guarantees pro-
9 vided under the project, services of claims analysts, offsite
10 utility and storm drainage system construction costs, and
11 site acquisition, or for any of the purposes set forth in
12 sections 316, 2404, 2406 and chapter 81 of title 38,
13 United States Code, not otherwise provided for, where the
14 estimated cost of a project is equal to or less than the
15 amount set forth in section 8104(a)(3)(A) of title 38,
16 United States Code, \$680,000,000, of which
17 \$612,000,000 shall remain available until September 30,
18 2028, and of which \$68,000,000 shall remain available
19 until expended, along with unobligated balances of pre-
20 vious “Construction, Minor Projects” appropriations
21 which are hereby made available for any project where the
22 estimated cost is equal to or less than the amount set forth
23 in such section: *Provided*, That funds made available
24 under this heading shall be for: (1) repairs to any of the
25 nonmedical facilities under the jurisdiction or for the use

1 of the Department which are necessary because of loss or
2 damage caused by any natural disaster or catastrophe;
3 and (2) temporary measures necessary to prevent or to
4 minimize further loss by such causes.

5 GRANTS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF STATE EXTENDED CARE
6 FACILITIES

7 For grants to assist States to acquire or construct
8 State nursing home and domiciliary facilities and to re-
9 model, modify, or alter existing hospital, nursing home,
10 and domiciliary facilities in State homes, for furnishing
11 care to veterans as authorized by sections 8131 through
12 8137 of title 38, United States Code, \$164,000,000, to
13 remain available until expended.

14 GRANTS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF VETERANS CEMETERIES

15 For grants to assist States and tribal organizations
16 in establishing, expanding, or improving veterans ceme-
17 teries as authorized by section 2408 of title 38, United
18 States Code, \$60,000,000, to remain available until ex-
19 pended.

20 COST OF WAR TOXIC EXPOSURES FUND

21 For investment in the delivery of veterans' health
22 care associated with exposure to environmental hazards,
23 the expenses incident to the delivery of veterans' health
24 care and benefits associated with exposure to environ-
25 mental hazards, and medical and other research relating

1 to exposure to environmental hazards, as authorized by
2 section 324 of title 38, United States Code, and in addi-
3 tion to amounts otherwise available for such purposes in
4 the appropriations provided in this or prior Acts,
5 \$5,542,000,000, to remain available until September 30,
6 2028: *Provided*, That not later than 30 days after the date
7 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs
8 shall submit to the Committees on Appropriations of both
9 Houses of Congress an expenditure plan for funds pro-
10 vided under this heading for fiscal year 2024.

11 ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

12 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

13 SEC. 201. Any appropriation for fiscal year 2024 for
14 “Compensation and Pensions”, “Readjustment Benefits”,
15 and “Veterans Insurance and Indemnities” may be trans-
16 ferred as necessary to any other of the mentioned appro-
17 priations: *Provided*, That, before a transfer may take
18 place, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall request from
19 the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Con-
20 gress the authority to make the transfer and such Com-
21 mittees issue an approval, or absent a response, a period
22 of 30 days has elapsed.

23 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

24 SEC. 202. Amounts made available for the Depart-
25 ment of Veterans Affairs for fiscal year 2024, in this or

1 any other Act, under the “Medical Services”, “Medical
2 Community Care”, “Medical Support and Compliance”,
3 and “Medical Facilities” accounts may be transferred
4 among the accounts: *Provided*, That any transfers among
5 the “Medical Services”, “Medical Community Care”, and
6 “Medical Support and Compliance” accounts of 1 percent
7 or less of the total amount appropriated to the account
8 in this or any other Act may take place subject to notifica-
9 tion from the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to the Com-
10 mittees on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress of
11 the amount and purpose of the transfer: *Provided further*,
12 That any transfers among the “Medical Services”, “Med-
13 ical Community Care”, and “Medical Support and Compli-
14 ance” accounts in excess of 1 percent, or exceeding the
15 cumulative 1 percent for the fiscal year, may take place
16 only after the Secretary requests from the Committees on
17 Appropriations of both Houses of Congress the authority
18 to make the transfer and an approval is issued: *Provided*
19 *further*, That any transfers to or from the “Medical Facili-
20 ties” account may take place only after the Secretary re-
21 quests from the Committees on Appropriations of both
22 Houses of Congress the authority to make the transfer
23 and an approval is issued.

24 SEC. 203. Appropriations available in this title for
25 salaries and expenses shall be available for services au-

1 thORIZED by section 3109 of title 5, United States Code;
2 hire of passenger motor vehicles; lease of a facility or land
3 or both; and uniforms or allowances therefore, as author-
4 ized by sections 5901 through 5902 of title 5, United
5 States Code.

6 SEC. 204. No appropriations in this title (except the
7 appropriations for “Construction, Major Projects”, and
8 “Construction, Minor Projects”) shall be available for the
9 purchase of any site for or toward the construction of any
10 new hospital or home.

11 SEC. 205. No appropriations in this title shall be
12 available for hospitalization or examination of any persons
13 (except beneficiaries entitled to such hospitalization or ex-
14 amination under the laws providing such benefits to vet-
15 erans, and persons receiving such treatment under sec-
16 tions 7901 through 7904 of title 5, United States Code,
17 or the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency
18 Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.)), unless reim-
19 bursement of the cost of such hospitalization or examina-
20 tion is made to the “Medical Services” account at such
21 rates as may be fixed by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs.

22 SEC. 206. Appropriations available in this title for
23 “Compensation and Pensions”, “Readjustment Benefits”,
24 and “Veterans Insurance and Indemnities” shall be avail-
25 able for payment of prior year accrued obligations re-

1 quired to be recorded by law against the corresponding
2 prior year accounts within the last quarter of fiscal year
3 2023.

4 SEC. 207. Appropriations available in this title shall
5 be available to pay prior year obligations of corresponding
6 prior year appropriations accounts resulting from sections
7 3328(a), 3334, and 3712(a) of title 31, United States
8 Code, except that if such obligations are from trust fund
9 accounts they shall be payable only from “Compensation
10 and Pensions”.

11 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

12 SEC. 208. Notwithstanding any other provision of
13 law, during fiscal year 2024, the Secretary of Veterans
14 Affairs shall, from the National Service Life Insurance
15 Fund under section 1920 of title 38, United States Code,
16 the Veterans’ Special Life Insurance Fund under section
17 1923 of title 38, United States Code, and the United
18 States Government Life Insurance Fund under section
19 1955 of title 38, United States Code, reimburse the “Gen-
20 eral Operating Expenses, Veterans Benefits Administra-
21 tion” and “Information Technology Systems” accounts for
22 the cost of administration of the insurance programs fi-
23 nanced through those accounts: *Provided*, That reimburse-
24 ment shall be made only from the surplus earnings accu-
25 mulated in such an insurance program during fiscal year

1 2024 that are available for dividends in that program after
2 claims have been paid and actuarially determined reserves
3 have been set aside: *Provided further*, That if the cost of
4 administration of such an insurance program exceeds the
5 amount of surplus earnings accumulated in that program,
6 reimbursement shall be made only to the extent of such
7 surplus earnings: *Provided further*, That the Secretary
8 shall determine the cost of administration for fiscal year
9 2024 which is properly allocable to the provision of each
10 such insurance program and to the provision of any total
11 disability income insurance included in that insurance pro-
12 gram.

13 SEC. 209. Amounts deducted from enhanced-use
14 lease proceeds to reimburse an account for expenses in-
15 curred by that account during a prior fiscal year for pro-
16 viding enhanced-use lease services shall be available until
17 expended.

18 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

19 SEC. 210. Funds available in this title or funds for
20 salaries and other administrative expenses shall also be
21 available to reimburse the Office of Resolution Manage-
22 ment, Diversity and Inclusion, the Office of Employment
23 Discrimination Complaint Adjudication, and the Alter-
24 native Dispute Resolution function within the Office of
25 Human Resources and Administration for all services pro-

1 vided at rates which will recover actual costs but not to
2 exceed \$86,481,000 for the Office of Resolution Manage-
3 ment, Diversity and Inclusion, \$6,960,000 for the Office
4 of Employment Discrimination Complaint Adjudication,
5 and \$7,772,000 for the Alternative Dispute Resolution
6 function within the Office of Human Resources and Ad-
7 ministration: *Provided*, That payments may be made in
8 advance for services to be furnished based on estimated
9 costs: *Provided further*, That amounts received shall be
10 credited to the “General Administration” and “Informa-
11 tion Technology Systems” accounts for use by the office
12 that provided the service.

13 SEC. 211. No funds of the Department of Veterans
14 Affairs shall be available for hospital care, nursing home
15 care, or medical services provided to any person under
16 chapter 17 of title 38, United States Code, for a non-serv-
17 ice-connected disability described in section 1729(a)(2) of
18 such title, unless that person has disclosed to the Sec-
19 retary of Veterans Affairs, in such form as the Secretary
20 may require, current, accurate third-party reimbursement
21 information for purposes of section 1729 of such title: *Pro-*
22 *vided*, That the Secretary may recover, in the same man-
23 ner as any other debt due the United States, the reason-
24 able charges for such care or services from any person who
25 does not make such disclosure as required: *Provided fur-*

1 *ther*, That any amounts so recovered for care or services
2 provided in a prior fiscal year may be obligated by the
3 Secretary during the fiscal year in which amounts are re-
4 ceived.

5 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

6 SEC. 212. Notwithstanding any other provision of
7 law, proceeds or revenues derived from enhanced-use leas-
8 ing activities (including disposal) may be deposited into
9 the “Construction, Major Projects” and “Construction,
10 Minor Projects” accounts and be used for construction
11 (including site acquisition and disposition), alterations,
12 and improvements of any medical facility under the juris-
13 diction or for the use of the Department of Veterans Af-
14 fairs. Such sums as realized are in addition to the amount
15 provided for in “Construction, Major Projects” and “Con-
16 struction, Minor Projects”.

17 SEC. 213. Amounts made available under “Medical
18 Services” are available—

19 (1) for furnishing recreational facilities, sup-
20 plies, and equipment; and

21 (2) for funeral expenses, burial expenses, and
22 other expenses incidental to funerals and burials for
23 beneficiaries receiving care in the Department.

1 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

2 SEC. 214. Such sums as may be deposited into the
3 Medical Care Collections Fund pursuant to section 1729A
4 of title 38, United States Code, may be transferred to the
5 “Medical Services” and “Medical Community Care” ac-
6 counts to remain available until expended for the purposes
7 of these accounts.

8 SEC. 215. The Secretary of Veterans Affairs may
9 enter into agreements with Federally Qualified Health
10 Centers in the State of Alaska and Indian Tribes and
11 Tribal organizations which are party to the Alaska Native
12 Health Compact with the Indian Health Service, to pro-
13 vide healthcare, including behavioral health and dental
14 care, to veterans in rural Alaska. The Secretary shall re-
15 quire participating veterans and facilities to comply with
16 all appropriate rules and regulations, as established by the
17 Secretary. The term “rural Alaska” shall mean those
18 lands which are not within the boundaries of the munici-
19 pality of Anchorage or the Fairbanks North Star Borough.

20 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

21 SEC. 216. Such sums as may be deposited into the
22 Department of Veterans Affairs Capital Asset Fund pur-
23 suant to section 8118 of title 38, United States Code, may
24 be transferred to the “Construction, Major Projects” and

1 “Construction, Minor Projects” accounts, to remain avail-
2 able until expended for the purposes of these accounts.

3 SEC. 217. Not later than 30 days after the end of
4 each fiscal quarter, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall
5 submit to the Committees on Appropriations of both
6 Houses of Congress a report on the financial status of the
7 Department of Veterans Affairs for the preceding quarter:
8 *Provided*, That, at a minimum, the report shall include
9 the direction contained in the paragraph entitled “Quar-
10 terly reporting”, under the heading “General Administra-
11 tion” in the joint explanatory statement accompanying
12 Public Law 114–223.

13 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

14 SEC. 218. Amounts made available under the “Med-
15 ical Services”, “Medical Community Care”, “Medical Sup-
16 port and Compliance”, “Medical Facilities”, “General Op-
17 erating Expenses, Veterans Benefits Administration”,
18 “Board of Veterans Appeals”, “General Administration”,
19 and “National Cemetery Administration” accounts for fis-
20 cal year 2024 may be transferred to or from the “Informa-
21 tion Technology Systems” account: *Provided*, That such
22 transfers may not result in a more than 10 percent aggre-
23 gate increase in the total amount made available by this
24 Act for the “Information Technology Systems” account:
25 *Provided further*, That, before a transfer may take place,

1 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall request from the
2 Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress
3 the authority to make the transfer and an approval is
4 issued.

5 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

6 SEC. 219. Of the amounts appropriated to the De-
7 partment of Veterans Affairs for fiscal year 2024 for
8 “Medical Services”, “Medical Community Care”, “Medical
9 Support and Compliance”, “Medical Facilities”, “Con-
10 struction, Minor Projects”, and “Information Technology
11 Systems”, up to \$430,532,000, plus reimbursements, may
12 be transferred to the Joint Department of Defense—De-
13 partment of Veterans Affairs Medical Facility Demonstra-
14 tion Fund, established by section 1704 of the National De-
15 fense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2010 (Public Law
16 111–84; 123 Stat. 2571) and may be used for operation
17 of the facilities designated as combined Federal medical
18 facilities as described by section 706 of the Duncan Hun-
19 ter National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year
20 2009 (Public Law 110–417; 122 Stat. 4500): *Provided*,
21 That additional funds may be transferred from accounts
22 designated in this section to the Joint Department of De-
23 fense—Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Facility
24 Demonstration Fund upon written notification by the Sec-
25 retary of Veterans Affairs to the Committees on Appro-

1 priations of both Houses of Congress: *Provided further*,
2 That section 220 of title II of division J of Public Law
3 117–328 is repealed.

4 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

5 SEC. 220. Of the amounts appropriated to the De-
6 partment of Veterans Affairs which become available on
7 October 1, 2024, for “Medical Services”, “Medical Com-
8 munity Care”, “Medical Support and Compliance”, and
9 “Medical Facilities”, up to \$456,547,000, plus reimburse-
10 ments, may be transferred to the Joint Department of De-
11 fense—Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Facility
12 Demonstration Fund, established by section 1704 of the
13 National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2010
14 (Public Law 111–84; 123 Stat. 2571) and may be used
15 for operation of the facilities designated as combined Fed-
16 eral medical facilities as described by section 706 of the
17 Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for
18 Fiscal Year 2009 (Public Law 110–417; 122 Stat. 4500):
19 *Provided*, That additional funds may be transferred from
20 accounts designated in this section to the Joint Depart-
21 ment of Defense—Department of Veterans Affairs Med-
22 ical Facility Demonstration Fund upon written notifica-
23 tion by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to the Commit-
24 tees on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress.

1 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

2 SEC. 221. Such sums as may be deposited into the
3 Medical Care Collections Fund pursuant to section 1729A
4 of title 38, United States Code, for healthcare provided
5 at facilities designated as combined Federal medical facili-
6 ties as described by section 706 of the Duncan Hunter
7 National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2009
8 (Public Law 110–417; 122 Stat. 4500) shall also be avail-
9 able: (1) for transfer to the Joint Department of De-
10 fense—Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Facility
11 Demonstration Fund, established by section 1704 of the
12 National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2010
13 (Public Law 111–84; 123 Stat. 2571); and (2) for oper-
14 ations of the facilities designated as combined Federal
15 medical facilities as described by section 706 of the Dun-
16 can Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal
17 Year 2009 (Public Law 110–417; 122 Stat. 4500): *Pro-*
18 *vided*, That, notwithstanding section 1704(b)(3) of the
19 National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2010
20 (Public Law 111–84; 123 Stat. 2573), amounts trans-
21 ferred to the Joint Department of Defense—Department
22 of Veterans Affairs Medical Facility Demonstration Fund
23 shall remain available until expended.

1 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

2 SEC. 222. Of the amounts available in this title for
3 “Medical Services”, “Medical Community Care”, “Medical
4 Support and Compliance”, and “Medical Facilities”, a
5 minimum of \$15,000,000 shall be transferred to the
6 DOD–VA Health Care Sharing Incentive Fund, as au-
7 thorized by section 8111(d) of title 38, United States
8 Code, to remain available until expended, for any purpose
9 authorized by section 8111 of title 38, United States Code.

10 SEC. 223. The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall no-
11 tify the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of
12 Congress of all bid savings in a major construction project
13 that total at least \$5,000,000, or 5 percent of the pro-
14 grammed amount of the project, whichever is less: *Pro-*
15 *vided*, That such notification shall occur within 14 days
16 of a contract identifying the programmed amount: *Pro-*
17 *vided further*, That the Secretary shall notify the Commit-
18 tees on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress 14
19 days prior to the obligation of such bid savings and shall
20 describe the anticipated use of such savings.

21 SEC. 224. None of the funds made available for
22 “Construction, Major Projects” may be used for a project
23 in excess of the scope specified for that project in the origi-
24 nal justification data provided to the Congress as part of
25 the request for appropriations unless the Secretary of Vet-

1 erans Affairs receives approval from the Committees on
2 Appropriations of both Houses of Congress.

3 SEC. 225. Not later than 30 days after the end of
4 each fiscal quarter, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall
5 submit to the Committees on Appropriations of both
6 Houses of Congress a quarterly report containing perform-
7 ance measures and data from each Veterans Benefits Ad-
8 ministration Regional Office: *Provided*, That, at a min-
9 imum, the report shall include the direction contained in
10 the section entitled “Disability claims backlog”, under the
11 heading “General Operating Expenses, Veterans Benefits
12 Administration” in the joint explanatory statement accom-
13 panying Public Law 114–223: *Provided further*, That the
14 report shall also include information on the number of ap-
15 peals pending at the Veterans Benefits Administration as
16 well as the Board of Veterans Appeals on a quarterly
17 basis.

18 SEC. 226. The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall
19 provide written notification to the Committees on Appro-
20 priations of both Houses of Congress 15 days prior to or-
21 ganizational changes which result in the transfer of 25 or
22 more full-time equivalents from one organizational unit of
23 the Department of Veterans Affairs to another.

24 SEC. 227. The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall
25 provide on a quarterly basis to the Committees on Appro-

1 priations of both Houses of Congress notification of any
2 single national outreach and awareness marketing cam-
3 paign in which obligations exceed \$1,000,000.

4 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

5 SEC. 228. The Secretary of Veterans Affairs, upon
6 determination that such action is necessary to address
7 needs of the Veterans Health Administration, may trans-
8 fer to the “Medical Services” account any discretionary
9 appropriations made available for fiscal year 2024 in this
10 title (except appropriations made to the “General Oper-
11 ating Expenses, Veterans Benefits Administration” ac-
12 count) or any discretionary unobligated balances within
13 the Department of Veterans Affairs, including those ap-
14 propriated for fiscal year 2024, that were provided in ad-
15 vance by appropriations Acts: *Provided*, That transfers
16 shall be made only with the approval of the Office of Man-
17 agement and Budget: *Provided further*, That the transfer
18 authority provided in this section is in addition to any
19 other transfer authority provided by law: *Provided further*,
20 That no amounts may be transferred from amounts that
21 were designated by Congress as an emergency requirement
22 pursuant to a concurrent resolution on the budget or the
23 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
24 1985: *Provided further*, That such authority to transfer
25 may not be used unless for higher priority items, based

1 on emergent healthcare requirements, than those for
2 which originally appropriated and in no case where the
3 item for which funds are requested has been denied by
4 Congress: *Provided further*, That, upon determination that
5 all or part of the funds transferred from an appropriation
6 are not necessary, such amounts may be transferred back
7 to that appropriation and shall be available for the same
8 purposes as originally appropriated: *Provided further*,
9 That before a transfer may take place, the Secretary of
10 Veterans Affairs shall request from the Committees on
11 Appropriations of both Houses of Congress the authority
12 to make the transfer and receive approval of that request.

13 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

14 SEC. 229. Amounts made available for the Depart-
15 ment of Veterans Affairs for fiscal year 2024, under the
16 “Board of Veterans Appeals” and the “General Operating
17 Expenses, Veterans Benefits Administration” accounts
18 may be transferred between such accounts: *Provided*, That
19 before a transfer may take place, the Secretary of Vet-
20 erans Affairs shall request from the Committees on Appro-
21 priations of both Houses of Congress the authority to
22 make the transfer and receive approval of that request.

23 SEC. 230. The Secretary of Veterans Affairs may not
24 reprogram funds among major construction projects or
25 programs if such instance of reprogramming will exceed

1 \$7,000,000, unless such reprogramming is approved by
2 the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Con-
3 gress.

4 SEC. 231. (a) The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall
5 ensure that the toll-free suicide hotline under section
6 1720F(h) of title 38, United States Code—

7 (1) provides to individuals who contact the hot-
8 line immediate assistance from a trained profes-
9 sional; and

10 (2) adheres to all requirements of the American
11 Association of Suicidology.

12 (b)(1) None of the funds made available by this Act
13 may be used to enforce or otherwise carry out any Execu-
14 tive action that prohibits the Secretary of Veterans Affairs
15 from appointing an individual to occupy a vacant civil
16 service position, or establishing a new civil service position,
17 at the Department of Veterans Affairs with respect to
18 such a position relating to the hotline specified in sub-
19 section (a).

20 (2) In this subsection—

21 (A) the term “civil service” has the meaning
22 given such term in section 2101(1) of title 5, United
23 States Code; and

24 (B) the term “Executive action” includes—

1 (i) any Executive order, Presidential
2 memorandum, or other action by the President;
3 and

4 (ii) any agency policy, order, or other di-
5 rective.

6 (c)(1) The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall con-
7 duct a study on the effectiveness of the hotline specified
8 in subsection (a) during the 5-year period beginning on
9 January 1, 2016, based on an analysis of national suicide
10 data and data collected from such hotline.

11 (2) At a minimum, the study required by paragraph
12 (1) shall—

13 (A) determine the number of veterans who con-
14 tact the hotline specified in subsection (a) and who
15 receive follow up services from the hotline or mental
16 health services from the Department of Veterans Af-
17 fairs thereafter;

18 (B) determine the number of veterans who con-
19 tact the hotline who are not referred to, or do not
20 continue receiving, mental health care who commit
21 suicide; and

22 (C) determine the number of veterans described
23 in subparagraph (A) who commit or attempt suicide.

24 SEC. 232. Effective during the period beginning on
25 October 1, 2018, and ending on January 1, 2025, none

1 of the funds made available to the Secretary of Veterans
2 Affairs by this or any other Act may be obligated or ex-
3 pended in contravention of the “Veterans Health Adminis-
4 tration Clinical Preventive Services Guidance Statement
5 on the Veterans Health Administration’s Screening for
6 Breast Cancer Guidance” published on May 10, 2017, as
7 issued by the Veterans Health Administration National
8 Center for Health Promotion and Disease Prevention.

9 SEC. 233. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision
10 of law, the amounts appropriated or otherwise made avail-
11 able to the Department of Veterans Affairs for the “Med-
12 ical Services” account may be used to provide—

13 (1) fertility counseling and treatment using as-
14 sisted reproductive technology to a covered veteran
15 or the spouse of a covered veteran; or

16 (2) adoption reimbursement to a covered vet-
17 eran.

18 (b) In this section:

19 (1) The term “service-connected” has the
20 meaning given such term in section 101 of title 38,
21 United States Code.

22 (2) The term “covered veteran” means a vet-
23 eran, as such term is defined in section 101 of title
24 38, United States Code, who has a service-connected

1 disability that results in the inability of the veteran
2 to procreate without the use of fertility treatment.

3 (3) The term “assisted reproductive tech-
4 nology” means benefits relating to reproductive as-
5 sistance provided to a member of the Armed Forces
6 who incurs a serious injury or illness on active duty
7 pursuant to section 1074(c)(4)(A) of title 10, United
8 States Code, as described in the memorandum on
9 the subject of “Policy for Assisted Reproductive
10 Services for the Benefit of Seriously or Severely Ill/
11 Injured (Category II or III) Active Duty Service
12 Members” issued by the Assistant Secretary of De-
13 fense for Health Affairs on April 3, 2012, and the
14 guidance issued to implement such policy, including
15 any limitations on the amount of such benefits avail-
16 able to such a member except that—

17 (A) the time periods regarding embryo
18 cryopreservation and storage set forth in part
19 III(G) and in part IV(H) of such memorandum
20 shall not apply; and

21 (B) such term includes embryo
22 cryopreservation and storage without limitation
23 on the duration of such cryopreservation and
24 storage.

1 (4) The term “adoption reimbursement” means
2 reimbursement for the adoption-related expenses for
3 an adoption that is finalized after the date of the en-
4 actment of this Act under the same terms as apply
5 under the adoption reimbursement program of the
6 Department of Defense, as authorized in Depart-
7 ment of Defense Instruction 1341.09, including the
8 reimbursement limits and requirements set forth in
9 such instruction.

10 (c) Amounts made available for the purposes speci-
11 fied in subsection (a) of this section are subject to the
12 requirements for funds contained in section 508 of division
13 H of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2018 (Public
14 Law 115–141).

15 SEC. 234. None of the funds appropriated or other-
16 wise made available by this Act or any other Act for the
17 Department of Veterans Affairs may be used in a manner
18 that is inconsistent with: (1) section 842 of the Transpor-
19 tation, Treasury, Housing and Urban Development, the
20 Judiciary, the District of Columbia, and Independent
21 Agencies Appropriations Act, 2006 (Public Law 109–115;
22 119 Stat. 2506); or (2) section 8110(a)(5) of title 38,
23 United States Code.

24 SEC. 235. Section 842 of Public Law 109–115 shall
25 not apply to conversion of an activity or function of the

1 Veterans Health Administration, Veterans Benefits Ad-
2 ministration, or National Cemetery Administration to con-
3 tractor performance by a business concern that is at least
4 51 percent owned by one or more Indian Tribes as defined
5 in section 5304(e) of title 25, United States Code, or one
6 or more Native Hawaiian Organizations as defined in sec-
7 tion 637(a)(15) of title 15, United States Code.

8 SEC. 236. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b),
9 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, in consultation with the
10 Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Labor, shall dis-
11 continue using Social Security account numbers to identify
12 individuals in all information systems of the Department
13 of Veterans Affairs as follows:

14 (1) For all veterans submitting to the Secretary
15 of Veterans Affairs new claims for benefits under
16 laws administered by the Secretary, not later than
17 September 30, 2024.

18 (2) For all individuals not described in para-
19 graph (1), not later than March 23, 2026.

20 (b) The Secretary of Veterans Affairs may use a So-
21 cial Security account number to identify an individual in
22 an information system of the Department of Veterans Af-
23 fairs if and only if the use of such number is required
24 to obtain information the Secretary requires from an in-

1 formation system that is not under the jurisdiction of the
2 Secretary.

3 (c) The matter in subsections (a) and (b) shall super-
4 sede section 238 of division F of Public Law 116–94.

5 SEC. 237. For funds provided to the Department of
6 Veterans Affairs for each of fiscal year 2024 and 2025
7 for “Medical Services”, section 239 of division A of Public
8 Law 114–223 shall apply.

9 SEC. 238. None of the funds appropriated in this or
10 prior appropriations Acts or otherwise made available to
11 the Department of Veterans Affairs may be used to trans-
12 fer any amounts from the Filipino Veterans Equity Com-
13 pensation Fund to any other account within the Depart-
14 ment of Veterans Affairs.

15 SEC. 239. Of the funds provided to the Department
16 of Veterans Affairs for each of fiscal year 2024 and fiscal
17 year 2025 for “Medical Services”, funds may be used in
18 each year to carry out and expand the child care program
19 authorized by section 205 of Public Law 111–163, not-
20 withstanding subsection (e) of such section.

21 SEC. 240. None of the funds appropriated or other-
22 wise made available in this title may be used by the Sec-
23 retary of Veterans Affairs to enter into an agreement re-
24 lated to resolving a dispute or claim with an individual
25 that would restrict in any way the individual from speak-

1 ing to members of Congress or their staff on any topic
2 not otherwise prohibited from disclosure by Federal law
3 or required by Executive order to be kept secret in the
4 interest of national defense or the conduct of foreign af-
5 fairs.

6 SEC. 241. For funds provided to the Department of
7 Veterans Affairs for each of fiscal year 2024 and 2025,
8 section 258 of division A of Public Law 114–223 shall
9 apply.

10 SEC. 242. (a) None of the funds appropriated or oth-
11 erwise made available by this Act may be used to deny
12 an Inspector General funded under this Act timely access
13 to any records, documents, or other materials available to
14 the department or agency over which that Inspector Gen-
15 eral has responsibilities under the Inspector General Act
16 of 1978 (5 U.S.C. App.), or to prevent or impede the ac-
17 cess of the Inspector General to such records, documents,
18 or other materials, under any provision of law, except a
19 provision of law that expressly refers to such Inspector
20 General and expressly limits the right of access.

21 (b) A department or agency covered by this section
22 shall provide its Inspector General access to all records,
23 documents, and other materials in a timely manner.

24 (c) Each Inspector General shall ensure compliance
25 with statutory limitations on disclosure relevant to the in-

1 formation provided by the establishment over which that
2 Inspector General has responsibilities under the Inspector
3 General Act of 1978 (5 U.S.C. App.).

4 (d) Each Inspector General covered by this section
5 shall report to the Committee on Appropriations of the
6 Senate and the Committee on Appropriations of the House
7 of Representatives within 5 calendar days of any failure
8 by any department or agency covered by this section to
9 comply with this requirement.

10 SEC. 243. None of the funds made available in this
11 Act may be used in a manner that would increase wait
12 times for veterans who seek care at medical facilities of
13 the Department of Veterans Affairs.

14 SEC. 244. None of the funds appropriated or other-
15 wise made available by this Act to the Veterans Health
16 Administration may be used in fiscal year 2024 to convert
17 any program which received specific purpose funds in fis-
18 cal year 2023 to a general purpose funded program unless
19 the Secretary of Veterans Affairs submits written notifica-
20 tion of any such proposal to the Committees on Appropria-
21 tions of both Houses of Congress at least 30 days prior
22 to any such action and an approval is issued by the Com-
23 mittees.

24 SEC. 245. For funds provided to the Department of
25 Veterans Affairs for each of fiscal year 2024 and 2025,

1 section 248 of division A of Public Law 114–223 shall
2 apply.

3 SEC. 246. (a) None of the funds appropriated or oth-
4 erwise made available by this Act may be used to conduct
5 research commencing on or after October 1, 2019, that
6 uses any canine, feline, or non-human primate unless the
7 Secretary of Veterans Affairs approves such research spe-
8 cifically and in writing pursuant to subsection (b).

9 (b)(1) The Secretary of Veterans Affairs may approve
10 the conduct of research commencing on or after October
11 1, 2019, using canines, felines, or non-human primates if
12 the Secretary determines that—

13 (A) the scientific objectives of the research can
14 only be met by using such canines, felines, or non-
15 human primates;

16 (B) such scientific objectives are directly related
17 to an illness or injury that is combat-related; and

18 (C) the research is consistent with the revised
19 Department of Veterans Affairs canine research pol-
20 icy document dated December 15, 2017, including
21 any subsequent revisions to such document.

22 (2) The Secretary may not delegate the authority
23 under this subsection.

24 (c) If the Secretary approves any new research pursu-
25 ant to subsection (b), not later than 30 days before the

1 commencement of such research, the Secretary shall sub-
2 mit to the Committees on Appropriations of the Senate
3 and House of Representatives a report describing—

4 (1) the nature of the research to be conducted
5 using canines, felines, or non-human primates;

6 (2) the date on which the Secretary approved
7 the research;

8 (3) the justification for the determination of the
9 Secretary that the scientific objectives of such re-
10 search could only be met using canines, felines, or
11 non-human primates;

12 (4) the frequency and duration of such re-
13 search; and

14 (5) the protocols in place to ensure the neces-
15 sity, safety, and efficacy of the research.

16 (d) Not later than 180 days after the date of the en-
17 actment of this Act, and biannually thereafter, the Sec-
18 retary shall submit to such Committees a report describ-
19 ing—

20 (1) any research being conducted by the De-
21 partment of Veterans Affairs using canines, felines,
22 or non-human primates as of the date of the sub-
23 mittal of the report;

1 (2) the circumstances under which such re-
2 search was conducted using canines, felines, or non-
3 human primates;

4 (3) the justification for using canines, felines,
5 or non-human primates to conduct such research;
6 and

7 (4) the protocols in place to ensure the neces-
8 sity, safety, and efficacy of such research.

9 (e) The Department shall implement a plan under
10 which the Secretary will eliminate or reduce the research
11 conducted using canines, felines, or non-human primates
12 by not later than 5 years after the date of enactment of
13 Public Law 116–94.

14 SEC. 247. (a) The Secretary of Veterans Affairs may
15 use amounts appropriated or otherwise made available in
16 this title to ensure that the ratio of veterans to full-time
17 employment equivalents within any program of rehabilita-
18 tion conducted under chapter 31 of title 38, United States
19 Code, does not exceed 125 veterans to one full-time em-
20 ployment equivalent.

21 (b) Not later than 180 days after the date of the en-
22 actment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to Con-
23 gress a report on the programs of rehabilitation conducted
24 under chapter 31 of title 38, United States Code, includ-
25 ing—

1 (1) an assessment of the veteran-to-staff ratio
2 for each such program; and

3 (2) recommendations for such action as the
4 Secretary considers necessary to reduce the veteran-
5 to-staff ratio for each such program.

6 SEC. 248. Amounts made available for the “Veterans
7 Health Administration, Medical Community Care” ac-
8 count in this or any other Act for fiscal years 2024 and
9 2025 may be used for expenses that would otherwise be
10 payable from the Veterans Choice Fund established by
11 section 802 of the Veterans Access, Choice, and Account-
12 ability Act, as amended (38 U.S.C. 1701 note).

13 SEC. 249. Obligations and expenditures applicable to
14 the “Medical Services” account in fiscal years 2017
15 through 2019 for aid to state homes (as authorized by
16 section 1741 of title 38, United States Code) shall remain
17 in the “Medical Community Care” account for such fiscal
18 years.

19 SEC. 250. Of the amounts made available for the De-
20 partment of Veterans Affairs for fiscal year 2024, in this
21 or any other Act, under the “Veterans Health Administra-
22 tion—Medical Services”, “Veterans Health Administra-
23 tion—Medical Community Care”, “Veterans Health Ad-
24 ministration—Medical Support and Compliance”, and
25 “Veterans Health Administration—Medical Facilities” ac-

1 counts, \$1,279,096,000 shall be made available for gen-
2 der-specific care and programmatic efforts to deliver care
3 for women veterans.

4 SEC. 251. Notwithstanding any other law, by no later
5 than September 30, 2023, the Secretary shall commence
6 construction of the Community Based Outpatient Clinic
7 in Bakersfield, California in accordance with Lease
8 No.36C10F20L0008.

9 SEC. 252. None of the funds made available in this
10 Act shall be expended for monthly payments under Lease
11 No. VA10112R0032, including section 11 of the lease,
12 that exceed \$223,166.67 unless required for maintenance
13 and repairs or improvements related to the form, fit, or
14 function of the facility that directly enhances the safety
15 of veterans or improves healthcare services.

16 SEC. 253. Not later than 30 days after the end of
17 each fiscal quarter, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall
18 submit to the Committees on Appropriations of both
19 Houses of Congress a quarterly report on the status of
20 the “Veterans Medical Care and Health Fund”, estab-
21 lished to execute section 8002 of the American Rescue
22 Plan Act of 2021 (Public Law 117–2): *Provided*, That,
23 at a minimum, the report shall include an update on obli-
24 gations by program, project or activity and a plan for ex-
25 pending the remaining funds: *Provided further*, That the

1 Secretary of Veterans Affairs must submit notification of
2 any plans to reallocate funds from the current apportion-
3 ment categories of “Medical Services”, “Medical Support
4 and Compliance”, “Medical Facilities”, “Medical Commu-
5 nity Care”, or “Medical and Prosthetic Research”, includ-

14 out an order placed with the Department of Veterans Af-
15 fairs pursuant to section 1535 of title 31, United States
16 Code, that are available for obligation pursuant to section
17 7364(b)(1) of title 38, United States Code, are to remain
18 available for the liquidation of valid obligations incurred
19 by such corporation during the period of performance of
20 such order, provided that the Secretary of Veterans Af-
21 fairs determines that such amounts need to remain avail-
22 able for such liquidation.

23 SEC. 255. Unobligated balances available under the
24 headings “Construction, Major Projects” and “Construc-
25 tion, Minor Projects” may be obligated by the Secretary

1 of Veterans Affairs for a facility pursuant to section
2 2(e)(1) of the Communities Helping Invest through Prop-
3 erty and Improvements Needed for Veterans Act of 2016
4 (Public Law 114–294; 38 U.S.C. 8103 note), as amended,
5 to provide additional funds or to fund an escalation clause
6 under such section of such Act: *Provided*, That before such
7 unobligated balances are obligated pursuant to this sec-
8 tion, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall request from

15 For necessary expenses for maintenance, operation,

18 the purchase or lease of passenger motor vehicles for re-
19 placement on a one-for-one basis only, and not to exceed
20 \$2,000 for official reception and representation expenses,

18 main available until September 30, 2025, of which
19 \$8,940,000 shall remain available until expended for con-

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TITLE IV

GENERAL PROVISIONS

SEC. 401. No part of any appropriation contained in this Act shall remain available for obligation beyond the current fiscal year unless expressly so provided herein.

SEC. 402. None of the funds made available in this Act may be used for any program, project, or activity, when it is made known to the Federal entity or official to which the funds are made available that the program, project, or activity is not in compliance with any Federal law relating to risk assessment, the protection of private property rights, or unfunded mandates.

SEC. 403. All departments and agencies funded under this Act are encouraged, within the limits of the existing statutory authorities and funding, to expand their use of “E-Commerce” technologies and procedures in the conduct of their business practices and public service activities.

SEC. 404. Unless stated otherwise, all reports and notifications required by this Act shall be submitted to the Subcommittee on Military Construction and Veterans Affairs, and Related Agencies of the Committee on Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the Subcommittee on Military Construction and Veterans Affairs,

1 and Related Agencies of the Committee on Appropriations
2 of the Senate.

3 SEC. 405. None of the funds made available in this
4 Act may be transferred to any department, agency, or in-
5 strumentality of the United States Government except
6 pursuant to a transfer made by, or transfer authority pro-
7 vided in, this or any other appropriations Act.

8 SEC. 406. None of the funds made available in this
9 Act may be used for a project or program named for an
10 individual serving as a Member, Delegate, or Resident
11 Commissioner of the United States House of Representa-
12 tives.

13 SEC. 407. (a) Any agency receiving funds made avail-
14 able in this Act, shall, subject to subsections (b) and (c),
15 post on the public Web site of that agency any report re-
16 quired to be submitted by the Congress in this or any
17 other Act, upon the determination by the head of the agen-
18 cy that it shall serve the national interest.

19 (b) Subsection (a) shall not apply to a report if—

20 (1) the public posting of the report com-
21 promises national security; or

22 (2) the report contains confidential or propri-
23 etary information.

24 (c) The head of the agency posting such report shall
25 do so only after such report has been made available to

1 the requesting Committee or Committees of Congress for
2 no less than 30days.

3 SEC. 408. (a) None of the funds made available in
4 this Act may be used to maintain or establish a computer
5 network unless such network blocks the viewing,
6 downloading, and exchanging of pornography.

7 (b) Nothing in subsection (a) shall limit the use of
8 funds necessary for any Federal, State, tribal, or local law
9 enforcement agency or any other entity carrying out crimi-
10 nal investigations, prosecution, or adjudication activities.

11 SEC. 409. None of the funds made available in this
12 Act may be used by an agency of the executive branch
13 to pay for first-class travel by an employee of the agency
14 in contravention of sections 301–10.122 through 301–
15 10.124 of title 41, Code of Federal Regulations.

16 SEC. 410. None of the funds made available in this
17 Act may be used to execute a contract for goods or serv-
18 ices, including construction services, where the contractor
19 has not complied with Executive Order No. 12989.

20 SEC. 411. None of the funds made available by this
21 Act may be used in contravention of section 101(e)(8) of
22 title 10, United States Code.

23 SEC. 412. (a) IN GENERAL.—None of the funds ap-
24 propriated or otherwise made available to the Department
25 of Defense in this Act may be used to construct, renovate,

1 or expand any facility in the United States, its territories,
2 or possessions to house any individual detained at United
3 States Naval Station, Guantánamo Bay, Cuba, for the
4 purposes of detention or imprisonment in the custody or
5 under the control of the Department of Defense.

6 (b) The prohibition in subsection (a) shall not apply
7 to any modification of facilities at United States Naval
8 Station, Guantánamo Bay, Cuba.

9 (c) An individual described in this subsection is any
10 individual who, as of June 24, 2009, is located at United
11 States Naval Station, Guantánamo Bay, Cuba, and who—

12 (1) is not a citizen of the United States or a
13 member of the Armed Forces of the United States;
14 and

15 (2) is—

16 (A) in the custody or under the effective
17 control of the Department of Defense; or

18 (B) otherwise under detention at United
19 States Naval Station, Guantánamo Bay, Cuba.

20 SEC. 413. None of the funds appropriated by this Act
21 may be used in any way, directly or indirectly, to influence
22 congressional action on any legislation or appropriation
23 matter pending before Congress, other than to commu-
24 nicate to Members of Congress as described in 18 U.S.C.
25 1913.
