8 Federal Government, State and local governments, and
9 not-for-profit organizations in commemoration of the 75th
10 anniversary of World War II.

11 (b) **COMMEMORATIVE ACTIVITIES AND OBJEC-**
12 **TIVES.**—The commemorative program may include activi-
13 ties and ceremonies to achieve the following objectives:

14 (1) To thank and honor veterans of World War
15 II, including personnel who were held as prisoners of
16 war or listed as missing in action, for their service
17 and sacrifice on behalf of the United States and to
18 thank and honor the families of these veterans.

1 (2) To educate the public about the history of
2 World War II and highlight the service of the Armed
3 Forces during World War II and the contributions
4 of Federal agencies and governmental and non-
5 governmental organizations that served with, or in
6 support of, the Armed Forces.

7 (3) To pay tribute to the contributions made on
8 the home front by the people of the United States
9 during World War II.

10 (4) To recognize the contributions and sac-
11 rifices made by the allies of the United States dur-
12 ing World War II.

13 (c) NAMES AND SYMBOLS.—The Secretary of De-
14 fense shall have the sole and exclusive right to use the
15 name “The United States of America 75th Anniversary
16 of World War II Commemoration”, and such seal, em-
17 blems, and badges incorporating such name as the Sec-
18 retary may lawfully adopt. Nothing in this section may
19 be construed to supersede rights that are established or
20 vested before the date of the enactment of this Act.

21 (d) COMMEMORATIVE FUND.—

22 (1) ESTABLISHMENT AND ADMINISTRATION.—
23 Upon the Secretary establishing the commemorative
24 program under subsection (a), the Secretary of the
25 Treasury shall establish in the Treasury of the

1 United States an account to be known as the “De-
2 partment of Defense World War II Commemoration
3 Fund” (in this section referred to as the “Fund”).
4 The Fund shall be administered by the Secretary of
5 Defense.

6 (2) USE OF FUND.—The Secretary of Defense
7 shall use the assets of the Fund only for the purpose
8 of conducting the commemorative program and pro-
9 viding grants to State and local governments and
10 not-for-profit organizations for commemorative ac-
11 tivities, and shall prescribe such regulations regard-
12 ing the use of the Fund as the Secretary considers
13 to be necessary.

14 (3) DEPOSITS.—The following shall be depos-
15 ited into the Fund:

16 (A) Amounts appropriated to the Fund.

17 (B) Proceeds derived from the Secretary’s
18 use of the exclusive rights described in sub-
19 section (c).

20 (C) Donations made in support of the com-
21 memorative program by private and corporate
22 donors.

23 (D) Funds transferred to the Fund by the
24 Secretary from funds appropriated for fiscal

1 year 2019 and subsequent years for the Depart-
2 ment of Defense.

3 (4) AVAILABILITY.—Subject to subsection
4 (f)(2), amounts deposited under paragraph (3) shall
5 constitute the assets of the Fund and remain avail-
6 able until expended.

7 (5) BUDGET REQUEST.—The Secretary of De-
8 fense may establish a separate budget line for the
9 commemorative program. In the budget justification
10 materials submitted by the Secretary in support of
11 the budget of the President for any fiscal year for
12 which the Secretary establishes the separate budget
13 line, the Secretary shall—

14 (A) identify and explain any amounts ex-
15 pended for the commemorative program in the
16 fiscal year preceding the budget request;

17 (B) identify and explain the amounts being
18 requested to support the commemorative pro-
19 gram for the fiscal year of the budget request;
20 and

21 (C) present a summary of the fiscal status
22 of the Fund.

23 (c) ACCEPTANCE OF VOLUNTARY SERVICES.—

24 (1) AUTHORITY TO ACCEPT SERVICES.—Not-
25 withstanding section 1342 of title 31, United States

1 Code, the Secretary of Defense may accept from any
2 person voluntary services to be provided in further-
3 ance of the commemorative program. The Secretary
4 of Defense shall prohibit the solicitation of any vol-
5 untary services if the nature or circumstances of
6 such solicitation would compromise the integrity or
7 the appearance of integrity of any program of the
8 Department of Defense or of any individual involved
9 in the program.

10 (2) REIMBURSEMENT OF INCIDENTAL EX-
11 PENSES.—The Secretary may provide for reimburse-
12 ment of incidental expenses incurred by a person
13 providing voluntary services under this subsection.
14 The Secretary shall determine which expenses are el-
15 igible for reimbursement under this paragraph.

16 (f) FINAL REPORT.—

17 (1) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 60
18 days after the end of the commemorative program
19 established by the Secretary of Defense under sub-
20 section (a), the Secretary shall submit to Congress
21 a report containing an accounting of—

22 (A) all of the funds deposited into and ex-
23 pended from the Fund;

24 (B) any other funds expended under this
25 section; and

1 (C) any unobligated funds remaining in
2 the Fund.

3 (2) TREATMENT OF UNOBLIGATED FUNDS.—
4 Unobligated amounts remaining in the Fund as of
5 the end of the commemorative period shall be held
6 in the Fund until transferred by law.

7 (g) LIMITATION ON EXPENDITURES.—Total expendi-
8 tures from the Fund, using amounts appropriated to the
9 Department of Defense, may not exceed \$5,000,000 for
10 fiscal year 2019 or for any subsequent fiscal year to carry
11 out the commemorative program.

12 (h) FUNDING.—Of the amount authorized to be ap-
13 propriated by this Act or otherwise made available for fis-
14 cal year 2019 for operation and maintenance, Defense-
15 wide activities, \$2,000,000 shall be available for deposit

Mandatory Arbitration Briefing

“The committee directs the Secretary of Defense to provide a briefing to the House Committee on Armed Services not later than March 1, 2019, on steps the Department has taken to ensure compliance with the provisions of Subpart 222.74 of the Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement concerning restrictions on the use of mandatory arbitration agreements. The briefing shall include steps taken to ensure that the Department does not fund contracts in excess of \$1 million with contractors that require as a condition of employment that employees enter an agreement to resolve certain claims and torts through arbitration. The briefing shall also include steps taken to ensure that contractors have certified that covered subcontractors, as defined in the clause at 252.222-7006 of the Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement, have been required to agree not to enter into such agreements. The briefing shall also include the extent to which the Secretary of Defense has waived the requirements of this subpart. The briefing shall also include potential ways for Department of Defense to determine the prevalence of mandatory arbitration by Department of Defense contractors compared to contractors that do not do business with Department of Defense.”

Briefing on Athletic Footwear for New Recruits

The committee notes the health and safety of newly recruited servicemembers is of utmost importance. The committee notes athletic footwear furnished to new recruits upon entering the military should be consistently issued in a manner that accounts for each recruit's individual physiological requirement in order to prevent lower extremity musculoskeletal injuries. The committee directs the Department of Defense to provide a briefing to the House Committee on Armed Services, not later than November 1, 2018, on the Department's effort to examine, measure, and fit new recruits with athletic shoes in an effort to reduce and prevent injury. The briefing will present the information separately by individual service as well as in aggregate.

7 or an alternate tonnage measured under section 14302 of

9 14104 of such title), that is comparable to the Code of
10 Safe Practice for Large Commercial Yachts (commonly re-
11 ferred to as the "Large Commercial Yacht Code"), as pub-
