1 **TITLE II—RECONCILIATION**

2 **SEC. 201. RECONCILIATION IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENT-**
3 **ATIVES.**

4 (a) SUBMISSIONS.—In the House of Representatives,
5 not later than September 11, 2026, the committees named
6 in subsection (b) shall submit their recommendations on
7 changes in laws within their jurisdictions to the Com-
8 mittee on the Budget of the House of Representatives to
9 carry out this section.

10 (b) INSTRUCTIONS.—

11 (1) COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE.—The Com-
12 mittee on Agriculture shall submit changes in laws
13 within its jurisdiction that increase the deficit by not
14 more than \$12,000,000,000 for the period of fiscal
15 years 2027 through 2036.

16 (2) COMMITTEE ON ARMED SERVICES.—The
17 Committee on Armed Services shall submit changes
18 in laws within its jurisdiction that increase the def-
19 icit by not more than \$60,000,000,000 for the pe-
20 riod of fiscal years 2027 through 2036.

21 (3) PERMANENT SELECT COMMITTEE ON IN-
22 TELLIGENCE.—The Permanent Select Committee on
23 Intelligence shall submit changes in laws within its
24 jurisdiction that increase the deficit by not more

1 than \$13,000,000,000 for the period of fiscal years
2 2027 through 2036.

3 (4) COMMITTEE ON HOUSE ADMINISTRATION.—

4 The Committee on House Administration shall sub-
5 mit changes in laws within its jurisdiction that in-
6 crease the deficit by not more than \$10,000,000,000
7 for the period of fiscal years 2027 through 2036.

8 **TITLE III—RESERVE FUND**

9 **SEC. 301. RESERVE FUND FOR RECONCILIATION LEGISLA-**
10 **TION IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.**

11 (a) IN GENERAL.—In the House of Representatives,
12 the chair of the Committee on the Budget may revise the
13 allocations of a committee or committees, aggregates, and
14 other appropriate levels in this resolution for any bill or
15 joint resolution considered pursuant to section 201 con-
16 taining the recommendations of one or more committees,
17 or for one or more amendments to, a conference report
18 on, or an amendment between the Houses in relation to
19 such a bill or joint resolution, by the amounts necessary
20 to accommodate the budgetary effects of the legislation,
21 if the budgetary effects of the legislation comply with the
22 reconciliation instructions under this concurrent resolu-
23 tion.

24 (b) DETERMINATION OF COMPLIANCE.—For pur-
25 poses of this section, compliance with the reconciliation

1 instructions under this concurrent resolution shall be de-
2 termined by the chair of the Committee on the Budget
3 of the House of Representatives.

4 **TITLE IV—OTHER MATTERS**

5 **SEC. 401. ENFORCEMENT FILING.**

6 In the House of Representatives, if a concurrent reso-
7 lution on the budget for fiscal year 2027 is adopted with-
8 out the appointment of a committee of conference on the
9 disagreeing votes of the two Houses with respect to this
10 concurrent resolution on the budget, for the purpose of
11 enforcing the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C.
12 621 et seq.) and applicable rules and requirements set
13 forth in the concurrent resolution on the budget, the allo-
14 cations provided for in this subsection shall apply in the
15 House of Representatives in the same manner as if such
16 allocations were in a joint explanatory statement accom-
17 panying a conference report on the budget for fiscal year
18 2027. The chair of the Committee on the Budget of the
19 House of Representatives shall submit a statement for
20 publication in the Congressional Record containing—

21 (1) for the Committee on Appropriations, com-
22 mittee allocations for fiscal year 2027 consistent
23 with title I for the purpose of enforcing section 302
24 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C.
25 633); and

1 (2) for all committees other than the Com-
2 mittee on Appropriations, committee allocations con-
3 sistent with title I for fiscal year 2027 and for the
4 period of fiscal years 2027 through 2036 for the
5 purpose of enforcing section 302 of the Congres-
6 sional Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 633).

7 **SEC. 402. BUDGETARY TREATMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE**
8 **EXPENSES.**

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—In the House of Representatives,
10 notwithstanding section 302(a)(1) of the Congressional
11 Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 633(a)(1)), section 13301
12 of the Budget Enforcement Act of 1990, and section
13 2009a of title 39, United States Code, the report, joint
14 explanatory statement, or the statement filed pursuant to
15 section 401, as applicable, accompanying this concurrent
16 resolution shall include in its allocation to the Committee
17 on Appropriations under section 302(a) of the Congres-
18 sional Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 633(a)) amounts for
19 the discretionary administrative expenses of the Social Se-
20 curity Administration and the United States Postal Serv-
21 ice.

22 (b) SPECIAL RULE.—In the House of Representa-
23 tives, for purposes of enforcing section 302(f) of the Con-
24 gressional Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 633(f)), esti-
25 mates of the levels of total new budget authority and total

1 outlays provided by a measure shall include any discre-
2 tionary amounts described in subsection (a).

3 **SEC. 403. APPLICATION AND EFFECT OF CHANGES IN ALLO-**
4 **CATIONS AND AGGREGATES.**

5 (a) APPLICATION.—In the House of Representatives,
6 any adjustments of the allocations, aggregates, and other
7 budgetary levels made pursuant to this concurrent resolu-
8 tion shall—

9 (1) apply while that measure is under consider-
10 ation;

11 (2) take effect upon the enactment of that
12 measure; and

13 (3) be published in the Congressional Record as
14 soon as practicable.

15 (b) EFFECT OF CHANGED ALLOCATIONS AND AG-
16 GREGATES.—Revised allocations, aggregates, and other
17 budgetary levels resulting from these adjustments shall be
18 considered for the purposes of the Congressional Budget
19 Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 621 et seq.) as the allocations, ag-
20 gregates, or other budgetary levels contained in this con-
21 current resolution.

22 (c) BUDGET COMMITTEE DETERMINATIONS.—For
23 purposes of this concurrent resolution, the budgetary lev-
24 els for a fiscal year or period of fiscal years shall be deter-
25 mined on the basis of estimates made by the chair of the

1 Committee on the Budget of the House of Representa-
2 tives.

3 (d) AGGREGATES, ALLOCATIONS AND APPLICA-
4 TION.—In the House of Representatives, for purposes of
5 this concurrent resolution and budget enforcement, the
6 consideration of any bill or joint resolution, or amendment
7 thereto or conference report thereon, for which the chair
8 of the Committee on the Budget makes adjustments or
9 revisions in the allocations, aggregates, and other budg-
10 etary levels of this concurrent resolution shall not be sub-
11 ject to the point of order set forth in clause 10 of rule
12 XXI of the Rules of the House of Representatives.

13 **SEC. 404. ADJUSTMENTS TO REFLECT CHANGES IN CON-**
14 **CEPTS AND DEFINITIONS IN THE HOUSE OF**
15 **REPRESENTATIVES.**

16 In the House of Representatives, the chair of the
17 Committee on the Budget may adjust the appropriate ag-
18 gregates, allocations, and other budgetary levels in this
19 concurrent resolution for any change in budgetary con-
20 cepts and definitions consistent with section 251(b)(1) of
21 the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act
22 of 1985 (2 U.S.C. 901(b)(1)).

23 **SEC. 405. ADJUSTMENT FOR CHANGES IN THE BASELINE.**

24 In the House of Representatives, the chair of the
25 Committee on the Budget may adjust the allocations, ag-

1 gregates, and other appropriate budgetary levels in this
2 concurrent resolution to reflect changes resulting from the
3 Congressional Budget Office's update to its baseline for
4 fiscal years 2027 through 2036.

5 **SEC. 406. EMERGENCY REQUIREMENTS.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—If a bill, joint resolution, amend-
7 ment, or conference report making appropriations for dis-
8 cretionary amounts contains a provision providing new
9 budget authority and outlays, and a designation of such
10 provision as an emergency requirement, the chair of the
11 Committee on the Budget of the House shall not count
12 the budgetary effects of such provision for any purpose
13 in the House.

14 (b) APPLICATION.—

15 (1) EXCLUSION.—A proposal to strike a des-
16 ignation under subsection (a) shall be excluded from
17 an evaluation of budgetary effects for any purpose
18 in the House.

19 (2) AMENDMENT.—An amendment offered
20 under subsection (a) that also proposes to reduce
21 each amount appropriated or otherwise made avail-
22 able by the pending measure that is not required to
23 be appropriated or otherwise made available shall be
24 in order at any point in the reading of the pending
25 measure in the House.

1 (c) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this section, the
2 following definitions apply:

3 (1) EMERGENCY.—The term “emergency”
4 means a situation that—

5 (A) requires new budget authority and out-
6 lays (or new budget authority and the outlays
7 flowing therefrom) for the prevention or mitiga-
8 tion of, or response to, loss of life or property,
9 or a threat to national security; and

10 (B) is unanticipated.

11 (2) UNANTICIPATED.—The term “unantici-
12 pated” means that the underlying situation is—

13 (A) sudden, which means quickly coming
14 into being or not building up over time;

15 (B) urgent, which means a pressing and
16 compelling need requiring immediate action;

17 (C) unforeseen, which means not predicted
18 or anticipated as an emerging need; and

19 (D) temporary, which means not of a per-
20 manent duration.

21 **SEC. 407. ADDITIONAL ADJUSTMENTS.**

22 (a) ADJUSTMENT FOR DISASTER RELIEF.—The
23 chair of the Committee on the Budget of the House of
24 Representatives may adjust the allocations, aggregates,

1 and other appropriate budgetary levels in this concurrent
2 resolution as follows:

3 (1) IN GENERAL.—If a bill, joint resolution,
4 amendment, or conference report makes discre-
5 tionary appropriations that Congress designates as
6 being for disaster relief, the adjustment for fiscal
7 year 2027 shall be the total of such appropriations
8 for fiscal year 2027 designated as being for disaster
9 relief, but not to exceed the amount equal to the
10 total amount calculated for fiscal year 2027 in ac-
11 cordance with the formula in section 251(b)(2)(D)(i)
12 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Con-
13 trol Act of 1985 (2 U.S.C. 901(b)(2)(D)(i)) except
14 that such formula shall be applied by substituting
15 “fiscal year 2027” for “fiscal years 2024 and
16 2025”.

17 (2) DEFINITION.—As used in this subsection,
18 the term “disaster relief” means activities carried
19 out pursuant to a determination under section
20 102(2) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and
21 Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5122(2)).

22 (b) ADJUSTMENT FOR WILDFIRE SUPPRESSION.—
23 The chair of the Committee on the Budget of the House
24 of Representatives may adjust the allocations, aggregates,

1 and other appropriate budgetary levels in this concurrent
2 resolution as follows:

3 (1) IN GENERAL.—If a bill, joint resolution,
4 amendment, or conference report making discre-
5 tionary appropriations for fiscal year 2027 specifies
6 an amount for wildfire suppression operations in the
7 Wildland Fire Management accounts at the Depart-
8 ment of Agriculture or the Department of the Inte-
9 rior, then the adjustment shall be the amount of ad-
10 ditional new budget authority specified in such
11 measure as being for wildfire suppression operations
12 for fiscal year 2027, but shall not exceed
13 \$2,950,000,000.

14 (2) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this subsection,
15 the terms “additional new budget authority” and
16 “wildfire suppression operations” have the meanings
17 specified in subclauses (I) and (II), respectively, of
18 section 251(b)(2)(F)(ii) of the Balanced Budget and
19 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (2 U.S.C.
20 901(b)(2)(F)(ii)(I) and (II)).

21 (c) ADJUSTMENT FOR HEALTH CARE FRAUD AND
22 ABUSE CONTROL.—The chair of the Committee on the
23 Budget of the House of Representatives may adjust the
24 allocations, aggregates, and other appropriate budgetary
25 levels in this concurrent resolution as follows:

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—If a bill, joint resolution,
2 amendment, or conference report making discre-
3 tionary appropriations for fiscal year 2027 specifies
4 an amount for the health care fraud and abuse con-
5 trol program at the Department of Health and
6 Human Services (75–8393–0–7–571), then the ad-
7 justment shall be the amount of additional new
8 budget authority specified in such measure for such
9 program for fiscal year 2027, but shall not exceed
10 \$658,000,000.

11 (2) DEFINITION.—As used in this subsection,
12 the term “additional new budget authority” means
13 the amount provided for fiscal year 2027, in excess
14 of \$311,000,000, in a bill, joint resolution, amend-
15 ment, or conference report making discretionary ap-
16 propriations and specified to pay for the costs of the
17 health care fraud and abuse control program.

18 (d) ADJUSTMENT FOR CONTINUING DISABILITY RE-
19 VIEWS AND REDETERMINATIONS.—The chair of the Com-
20 mittee on the Budget of the House of Representatives may
21 adjust the allocations, aggregates, and other appropriate
22 budgetary levels in this concurrent resolution as follows:

23 (1) IN GENERAL.—If a bill, joint resolution,
24 amendment, or conference report making discre-
25 tionary appropriations for fiscal year 2027 specifies

1 an amount for continuing disability reviews under ti-
2 tles II and XVI of the Social Security Act (42
3 U.S.C. 401 et seq., 1381 et seq.), for the cost associ-
4 ated with conducting redeterminations of eligibility
5 under title XVI of the Social Security Act, for the
6 cost of co-operative disability investigation units, and
7 for the cost associated with the prosecution of fraud
8 in the programs and operations of the Social Secu-
9 rity Administration by Special Assistant United
10 States Attorneys, then the adjustment shall be the
11 additional new budget authority specified in such
12 measure for such expenses for fiscal year 2027, but
13 shall not exceed \$2,124,000,000.

14 (2) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this sub-
15 section—

16 (A) the term “continuing disability re-
17 views” means continuing disability reviews
18 under sections 221(i) and 1614(a)(4) of the So-
19 cial Security Act, including work-related con-
20 tinuing disability reviews to determine whether
21 earnings derived from services demonstrate an
22 individual’s ability to engage in substantial
23 gainful activity;

24 (B) the term “redetermination” means re-
25 determination of eligibility under sections

1 1611(c)(1) and 1614(a)(3)(H) of the Social Se-
2 curity Act (42 U.S.C. 1382(c)(1),
3 1382c(a)(3)(H)); and

4 (C) the term “additional new budget au-
5 thority” means the amount provided for fiscal
6 year 2027, in excess of \$273,000,000, in a bill,
7 joint resolution, amendment, or conference re-
8 port and specified to pay for the costs of con-
9 tinuing disability reviews, redeterminations, co-
10 operative disability investigation units, and
11 fraud prosecutions under the heading “Limita-
12 tion on Administrative Expenses” for the Social
13 Security Administration.

14 (e) ADJUSTMENT FOR REEMPLOYMENT SERVICES
15 AND ELIGIBILITY ASSESSMENTS.—The chair of the Com-
16 mittee on the Budget of the House of Representatives may
17 adjust the allocations, aggregates, and other appropriate
18 budgetary levels in this concurrent resolution as follows:

19 (1) IN GENERAL.—If a bill, joint resolution,
20 amendment, or conference report making discre-
21 tionary appropriations for fiscal year 2027 specifies
22 an amount for grants to States under section 306 of
23 the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 506) for claim-
24 ants of regular compensation, as defined in such sec-
25 tion, including those who are profiled as most likely

1 to exhaust their benefits, then the adjustment shall
2 be the additional new budget authority specified in
3 such measure for such grants for fiscal year 2027,
4 but shall not exceed \$400,000,000.

5 (2) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this subsection,
6 the term “additional new budget authority” means
7 the amount provided for fiscal year 2027, in excess
8 of \$117,000,000, in a bill, joint resolution, amend-
9 ment, or conference report making discretionary ap-
10 propriations and specified to pay for grants to
11 States under section 306 of the Social Security Act
12 (42 U.S.C. 506) for claimants of regular compensa-
13 tion, as defined in such section, including those who
14 are profiled as most likely to exhaust their benefits.

15 **SEC. 408. EXERCISE OF RULEMAKING POWERS.**

16 Congress adopts the provisions of this title—

17 (1) as an exercise of the rulemaking power of
18 the Senate and the House of Representatives, re-
19 spectively, and as such they shall be considered as
20 part of the rules of each House or of that House to
21 which they specifically apply, and such rules shall
22 supersede other rules only to the extent that they
23 are inconsistent with such other rules; and

24 (2) with full recognition of the constitutional
25 right of either the Senate or the House of Rep-

1 representatives to change those rules (insofar as they
2 relate to that House) at any time, in the same man-
3 ner, and to the same extent as is the case of any
4 other rule of the Senate or House of Representa-
5 tives.
