John E. Smith is Deputy Director of the U.S. Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC), which is responsible for administering economic and trade sanctions in furtherance of U.S. national security and foreign policy goals. OFAC implements sanctions against targeted foreign states, regimes, terrorists and their financial supporters, international narcotics traffickers, transnational criminal organizations, and weapons of mass destruction proliferators. As Deputy Director, Mr. Smith oversees the four components of OFAC, including its compliance and enforcement, global targeting, licensing, policy, regulatory, and resource management functions. Mr. Smith served as an OFAC Associate Director from 2007 to 2014, supervising the agency's compliance, licensing, policy, and regulatory divisions. Prior to joining OFAC in 2007, Mr. Smith served as an expert to the United Nations' Al-Qaida and Taliban Sanctions Committee from 2004 to 2007 and as a trial attorney at the U.S. Department of Justice from 1999 to 2004. Mr. Smith holds a JD (law) degree from Columbia Law School in New York and bachelor's degrees in journalism and political science from the University of Missouri-Columbia.
