

Jacqueline O'Neill Director, The Institute for Inclusive Security

Jacqueline O'Neill is the Director of The Institute for Inclusive Security, a Washington DC-based organization that promotes the inclusion of women in peace and security processes around the world. She is responsible for policy, advocacy, and research, programs. She oversees all regional initiatives (Afghanistan, Myanmary, Pakistan, South Sudan, Sudan, and Syria) as well as Inclusive Security's support to governments and civil society on the

creation and strengthening of national, cross-agency strategies and action plans. Ms. O'Neill also advises and trains military, police, and civilians serving NATO, the UN, the US military, and others.

Previously, Ms. O'Neill was a policy adviser to Canada's Secretary of State for Asia-Pacific. Along with former Lt. General Roméo Dallaire, she helped found an initiative to address the issue of child soldiers. Before joining Inclusive Security in 2006, she was concurrently at the UN Mission in Sudan and at Khartoum's Ahfad University for Women. Originally from Canada, she has a master's in public policy from Harvard's Kennedy School of Government and a bachelor of commerce from the University of Alberta.
