A BILL

To amend the Export Control Reform Act of 2018 relating
to licensing transparency.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Maintaining American
5 Superiority by Improving Export Control Transparency
6 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. LICENSING TRANSPARENCY.**

2 Section 1756 of the Export Control Reform Act of
3 2018 (50 U.S.C. 4815) is amended by adding at the end
4 the following:

5 “(e) REPORT.—

6 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days
7 after the date of the enactment of this subsection,
8 and not less frequently than every 90 days there-
9 after, the Secretary, shall submit to the appropriate
10 congressional committees a report on license applica-
11 tions, enforcement actions, and other requests for
12 authorization for the export, reexport, release, and
13 in-country transfer of items controlled under this
14 part to covered entities.

15 “(2) ELEMENTS.—The report required by para-
16 graph (1) shall include, with respect to the preceding
17 90-day period, the following:

18 “(A) For each license application or other
19 request for authorization—

20 “(i) the name of the entity submitting
21 the application (both parent company as
22 well as the subsidiary directly involved), a
23 brief description of the item (including the
24 Export Control Classification Number
25 (ECCN) and level of control, if applicable),
26 the name of the end-user, the end-user’s

1 location, a value estimate, decision with re-
2 spect to the license application or author-
3 ization, and the date of submission; and

4 “(ii) the date, location, and result of
5 site inspections, monitoring, and enforce-
6 ment actions to ensure compliance with
7 United States export controls.

8 “(B) Aggregate statistics on all license ap-
9 plications and other requests for authorization
10 as described in subparagraph (A).

11 “(C) For each license denial in which items
12 in category EAR99 constitute at least 50 per-
13 cent of the financial value of the license applica-
14 tion, a list detailing what specific items are
15 being denied a license.

16 “(3) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

17 “(A) the term ‘appropriate congressional
18 committees’ means—

19 “(i) the Committee on Foreign Affairs
20 of the House of Representatives; and

21 “(ii) the Committee on Banking,
22 Housing, and Urban Affairs of the Senate;
23 and

24 “(B) the term ‘covered entity’ means any
25 entity included on—

1 “(i) the list maintained and set forth
2 in Supplement No. 4 to part 744 of the
3 Export Administration Regulations;
4 “(ii) the list maintained and set forth
5 in Supplement No. 7 to part 744 of the
6 Export Administration Regulations; or
7 “(iii) the list maintained and pub-
8 lished under section 1260H of the William
9 M. (Mac) Thornberry National Defense
10 Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2021
11 (10 U.S.C. 113 note).”.
