

**AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
TO H.R. 7089
OFFERED BY MR. JAMES OF MICHIGAN**

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the “Global Anti-Human
3 Trafficking Enhancement Act”.

**4 SEC. 2. EXPANDING PROTECTION AND PROSECUTION EF-
5 FORTS AT THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT
6 OF STATE.**

7 (a) INVESTIGATION AUTHORITY.—The Secretary of
8 State is authorized to investigate transnational violations
9 of chapter 77 of title 18, United States Code, in which
10 part of the offense conduct occurred outside the United
11 States or involved 1 or more foreign nationals.

12 (b) AUTHORITIES.—Section 37(a)(1) of the State De-
13 partment Basic Authorities Act of 1956 (22 U.S.C.
14 2709(a)(1)) is amended—

15 (1) in subparagraph (B), by striking “; or” and
16 inserting a semicolon;

17 (2) by redesignating subparagraph (C) as sub-
18 paragraph (D); and

1 (3) by inserting after subparagraph (B) the fol-
2 lowing new subparagraph:

3 “(C) transnational violations of chapter 77
4 of title 18, United States Code, in which any
5 part of the offense conduct occurred outside the
6 United States or involved one or more foreign
7 nationals; or”.

8 **SEC. 3. REPORT.**

9 Not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment
10 of this Act, and annually thereafter for six years, the Sec-
11 retary of State shall submit to the Committee on Foreign
12 Affairs of the House of Representatives and the Com-
13 mittee on Foreign Relations of the Senate a report that
14 includes each of the following:

15 (1) The number of relevant cases opened and
16 investigated by the Diplomatic Security Service as a
17 result of the additional authorities granted by the
18 amendments made by this Act.

19 (2) The percentage of the cases opened and in-
20 vestigated by the Diplomatic Security Service as a
21 result of the additional authorities granted by the
22 amendments made by this Act that were referred for
23 further action, including prosecution.

24 (3) An assessment of the efficacy of the au-
25 thorities granted by the amendments made by this

1 Act and whether such authorities are sufficient to
2 meaningfully contribute to Department of State and
3 broader United States Government efforts to pros-
4 ecute and prevent, where applicable, human traf-
5 ficking and transnational violations of chapter 77 of
6 title 18, United States Code.

7 (4) An assessment of whether the resources of
8 the Diplomatic Security Service are sufficient to ef-
9 fectively carry out the objectives of this Act.

10 **SEC. 4. SUNSET.**

11 This Act and the amendments made by this Act shall
12 terminate on the date that is 7 years after the date of
13 the enactment of this Act, and the provisions of law
14 amended by such amendments shall be restored as if such
15 amendments had not been enacted.
