## AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5300 OFFERED BY MS. JAYAPAL OF WASHINGTON

At the appropriate place, insert the following:

1	SEC USE OF UNITED STATES INFLUENCE AT THE
2	UNITED NATIONS.
3	(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State and the
4	United States Permanent Representative to the United
5	Nations shall use the voice, vote, and influence of the
6	United States at the United Nations and other multilat-
7	eral bodies to—
8	(1) advocate for unimpeded humanitarian ac-
9	cess and an immediate end to bureaucratic impedi-
10	ments to humanitarian assistance in Sudan;
11	(2) support the documentation of atrocities in-
12	cluding possible genocide, war crimes, and crimes
13	against humanity;
14	(3) ensure development of plans for protection
15	of civilians in Sudan; and
16	(4) advocate for an end to hostilities in Sudan.
17	(b) Additional Actions.—The Secretary of State,
18	in coordination with the United States Permanent Rep-
19	resentative to the United Nations, shall—

1	(1) take immediate steps with the United Na-
2	tions General Assembly's Credentials Committee to
3	trigger Rule 29 of the Rules of Procedure to
4	delegitimize the presence of the Sudanese represen-
5	tation in international bodies as legitimate rep-
6	resentatives of the Republic of Sudan, until such
7	time as the Secretary determines Sudan has
8	transitioned to a civilian-led or democratically-elect-
9	ed government;
10	(2) seek to expand the United Nations Security
11	Council arms embargo against Darfur to be a na-
12	tionwide, whole-of-Sudan arms embargo; and
13	(3) identify impediments to local community-
14	based organizations that are currently providing
15	non-lethal assistance to the Sudanese people in con-
16	flict-affected areas that traditional implementing
17	partners cannot reach, including for the delivery of
18	food, medical aid, and shelter to individuals im-
19	pacted by the war in Sudan, and submit, not later
20	than 120 days after the date of the enactment of
21	this Act, to the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
22	House of Representatives and the Committee on
23	Foreign Relations of the Senate a report that identi-
24	fies such impediments.
