. PROTECTING PORT SUDAN AND RED SEA STA-

2	BILITY FROM IRANIAN ENTRENCHMENT.
3	(a) In General.—The Secretary, acting through the
4	Assistant Secretary for African Affairs and in coordina-
5	tion with the Assistant Secretary for Near Eastern Af-
6	fairs, the Assistant Secretary for Political-Military Affairs,
7	and the Assistant Secretary for Intelligence and Research,
8	shall maintain responsibility for assessing and mitigating
9	the implications of Iranian naval access to ports on the
10	Red Sea, including Port Sudan.
11	(b) Responsibilities.—The responsibilities de-
12	scribed in subsection (a) shall also include—
13	(1) evaluating risks to regional stability, mari-
14	time security, and international commerce arising
15	from Iranian naval access or entrenchment along the
16	Red Sea littoral; and
17	(2) coordinating diplomatic, security, and eco-
18	nomic measures with relevant United States depart-
19	ments and agencies and with regional partners and
20	multilateral maritime-security efforts to detect,

1	deter, and disrupt Iranian efforts to obtain or lever-
2	age such access for weapons transfers, intelligence
3	collection, or coercive diplomacy.
4	(c) Assessments.—Any assessments maintained
5	pursuant to this section shall be available for review upon
6	request by the appropriate congressional committees.
7	(d) Definition.—In this section, the term "Iranian
8	naval access" means port visits, logistics support or re-
9	plenishment, basing or other access arrangements, or in-
10	telligence collection activities by the Islamic Republic of
11	Iran Navy or the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps-
12	Navy, or any agent or affiliate thereof.
13	(e) Rule of Construction.—Nothing in this sec-
14	tion may be construed—
15	(1) to authorize security assistance or benefits
16	to any Sudanese actor in contravention of applicable
17	sanctions or restrictions;
18	(2) to alter any authority of the Secretary of
19	Defense or any element of the Department of De-
20	fense with respect to maritime security operations;
21	or
22	(3) to create any new reporting requirement to
23	Congress.
