Mr. FINE (for himself and Mr. MILLER of Ohio) introduced the following bill;
which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

A BILL

To require the Department of State to provide briefings
on antisemitism in Europe.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting Europe
5 from Antisemitic Crime and Extremism Act” or the
6 “PEACE Act”.

7 **SEC. 2. BRIEFINGS ON ANTISEMITISM IN EUROPE.**

8 (a) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-
9 gress that—

1 (1) the Assistant Secretary for European and
2 Eurasian Affairs, in consultation with other relevant
3 officials of the Department of State, should assess
4 the persistent and growing threat of antisemitism
5 and acts of international terrorism in Europe as a
6 matter of importance to the foreign policy of the
7 United States; and

8 (2) the Under Secretary for Political Affairs,
9 acting through the Assistant Secretary for European
10 and Eurasian Affairs, should diplomatically engage
11 governments of countries of apparent concern on ef-
12 forts for transatlantic cooperation to counter and
13 address antisemitism and acts of international ter-
14 rorism that may threaten transatlantic stability, the
15 safety and security of United States citizens, and in-
16 stitutions abroad.

17 (b) BRIEFING.—Not later than 180 days after the
18 date of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter
19 for two years, the Assistant Secretary for European and
20 Eurasian Affairs shall provide a briefing to the appro-
21 priate congressional committees on the matters described
22 in subsection (a).

23 (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-
24 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congres-
25 sional committees” means—

- 1 (1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
- 2 House of Representatives; and
- 3 (2) the Committee on Foreign Relations of the
- 4 Senate.

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
