-Government of Japan: Approximately \$1.2 million over two years for studies, conferences, seminars and publications.

- Although I did not work on these projects and did not benefit from any of the financial support, since 2013, CSIS has received the following Federal grants or contracts related to the hearing topic: *None*
- Although I did not work on these projects and did not benefit from any of the financial support, since 2013, CSIS has received the following funding originating with a foreign government related to the hearing topic:

- European Commission: *Approximately \$50,000 for a dialogue on the region.*
- Government of Germany: *Approximately \$25,000 for a dialogue on the region.*
- Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO): *Approximately \$200,000 over two years for conferences and studies.*
- Government of Korea: *Approximately \$250,000 over two years for studies and conferences.*
- Government of Taiwan: *Approximately over two years \$350,000 for studies.*
- Government of Thailand: *Approximately \$37,000 for a speaker series.*
- Government of the Philippines: *Approximately \$10,000 for a conference.*
- Government of Vietnam: *Approximately \$140,000 over two years for conferences.*
