Bianca Jagger has committed her life to defending human rights, social justice, and environmental protection. At the heart of her human rights work is promoting women's rights, achieving gender equality, and ending violence against women and girls. In her role as Council of Europe Goodwill Ambassador to Abolish the Death Penalty, she campaigns for the world abolition of capital punishment.

Born in Managua, Nicaragua, Bianca Jagger left her native country to study political science in Paris with a scholarship from the French Government. She is a Nicaraguan and British citizen.

She is Founder and President of the <u>Bianca Jagger Human Rights</u> <u>Foundation</u> (BJHRF), which she established in 2005 to be a force for change and a voice for the most vulnerable.

She is <u>Council of Europe Goodwill Ambassador</u>, a Member of the Executive Director's Leadership Council for <u>Amnesty International USA</u> and IUCN Bonn Challenge Ambassador.

Bianca Jagger is the recipient of numerous prestigious awards, including <u>The Right Livelihood Award</u> (2004) also known as the 'alternative Nobel prize' for her "long-standing commitment and dedicated campaigning over a wide range of issues of human rights, social justice and environmental protection, including the abolition of the death penalty, the prevention of child abuse, the rights of indigenous peoples and the environment that supports them, and the prevention and healing of armed conflicts".
