Hal Brands is the Henry A. Kissinger Distinguished Professor of Global Affairs at the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS) and a Senior Fellow at the Center for Strategic and Budgetary Assessments (CSBA). He is also a columnist for *Bloomberg Opinion*. He previously served as Special Assistant to the Secretary of Defense for Strategic Planning from 2015 to 2016, and as lead writer for the Commission on the National Defense Strategy for the United States from 2017 to 2018. He has also consulted with a range of government offices and agencies in the intelligence and national security communities. He is the author of several books, including *American Grand Strategy in the Age of Trump* (2018) and *What Good is Grand Strategy? Power and Purpose in American Statecraft from Harry S. Truman to George W. Bush* (2014). His newest book is *The Lessons of Tragedy: Statecraft and World Order* (2019), co-authored with Charles Edel.
