

Philippe Le Corre is a Senior Fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School's Mossavar-Rahmani Center for Business and Government, and a Non-resident Senior Fellow with the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. Mr. Le Corre was previously a Fellow at The Brookings Institution. He served as a Special Assistant for international affairs to the French Defense Minister from 2004-2007, and as a Senior Policy Adviser on Asia in the Defense Ministry's policy planning staff. Mr. Le Corre has been specializing in EU-China relations, outbound Chinese direct investments and great powers competition. He is currently heading a project that looks at perceptions in Europe and Central Asia of China's global rise, with a comparative angle.

Mr. Le Corre has spoken on the subject at Harvard, Princeton, Johns Hopkins and Boston University, and contributed to numerous publications, including The Wall Street Journal, The Financial Times, The National Interest, Nikkei Asian Review and Foreign Affairs. His last book is *China's Offensive in Europe* (Brookings Institution Press, 2016). He is also the author of several recent reports on the subject, including *China's rise as a Geoeconomic influencer. Four European Case Studies* (Carnegie Working Paper, October 2018) and *Kazakhs wary of Chinese Embrace as BRI gathers steam* (National University of Singapore, February 2019).
